- 1 AN ACT Relating to protecting waterways from pollution from
- 2 synthetic plastic microbeads; adding a new chapter to Title 70 RCW;
- 3 and prescribing penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The definitions in this section apply
- 6 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires
- 7 otherwise.

- (1) "Department" means the department of ecology.
- 9 (2) "Over-the-counter drug" means a drug that is required by 21
- 10 C.F.R. 201.66, as it existed on the effective date of this section,
- 11 to contain a label that identifies the product as a drug, displays a
- 12 drug facts panel, and provides a statement regarding the active
- 13 ingredient or active ingredients contained in the compound,
- 14 substance, or preparation.
- 15 (3) "Personal care product" means an article, or item intended to
- 16 be included as a component of an article, intended to be rubbed,
- 17 poured, sprinkled, sprayed on, introduced into, or otherwise applied
- 18 to the human body for cleansing, beautifying, promoting
- 19 attractiveness, or altering the appearance. This term includes, but
- 20 is not limited to, hand and body soap, exfoliants, shampoos,
- 21 toothpastes, and scrubs.

- 1 (4) "Plastic" means a synthetic material made from linking 2 monomers through a chemical reaction to create an organic polymer 3 chain that can be molded or extruded at high heat into various solid 4 forms retaining their defined shapes during their life cycle and 5 after disposal.
- 6 (5) "Synthetic plastic microbead" means an intentionally added 7 nonbiodegradable solid plastic particle measuring less than five 8 millimeters in size and used to exfoliate or cleanse in a rinse-off 9 product.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. As of January 1, 2018, a person may not produce or manufacture a personal care product containing synthetic plastic microbeads in the state of Washington.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. As of January 1, 2020, a person may not:
- 14 (1) Knowingly accept for sale in the state of Washington a 15 personal care product or an over-the-counter drug containing 16 synthetic plastic microbeads; or
- 17 (2) Produce or manufacture an over-the-counter drug containing 18 synthetic plastic microbeads in the state of Washington.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. (1) The department may impose a civil penalty of not less than one thousand dollars, and not more than ten thousand dollars, for each violation of this chapter. If the violation is of a continuing manner, each day during which it continues constitutes an additional, separate, and distinct offense.
- (2) The department may, in addition to imposing civil penalties under this section, bring an action in a court of competent jurisdiction seeking injunctive relief to prevent or end a violation of this chapter and the court may grant the requested injunction.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** The provisions of this chapter preempt and supersede any ordinance by a city, county, or other municipality concerning synthetic plastic microbeads.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. Sections 1 through 5 of this act constitute a new chapter in Title 70 RCW.
