1 AN ACT Relating to modifying the definition of resident student
2 to comply with federal requirements established by the veterans
3 access, choice, and accountability act of 2014; amending RCW
4 28B.15.012; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.15.012 and 2014 c 183 s 1 are each amended to
7 read as follows:

8 Whenever used in this chapter:

9 (1) The term "institution" shall mean a public university,
10 college, or community college within the state of Washington.

11 (2) The term "resident student" shall mean:

12 (a) A financially independent student who has had a domicile in
13 the state of Washington for the period of one year immediately prior
14 to the time of commencement of the first day of the semester or
15 quarter for which the student has registered at any institution and
16 has in fact established a bona fide domicile in this state primarily
17 for purposes other than educational;

18 (b) A dependent student, if one or both of the student's parents
19 or legal guardians have maintained a bona fide domicile in the state
20 of Washington for at least one year immediately prior to commencement

1 of the semester or quarter for which the student has registered at
2 any institution;

3 (c) A student classified as a resident based upon domicile by an
4 institution on or before May 31, 1982, who was enrolled at a state
5 institution during any term of the 1982-1983 academic year, so long
6 as such student's enrollment (excepting summer sessions) at an
7 institution in this state is continuous;

8 (d) Any student who has spent at least seventy-five percent of
9 both his or her junior and senior years in high schools in this
10 state, whose parents or legal guardians have been domiciled in the
11 state for a period of at least one year within the five-year period
12 before the student graduates from high school, and who enrolls in a
13 public institution of higher education within six months of leaving
14 high school, for as long as the student remains continuously enrolled
15 for three quarters or two semesters in any calendar year;

16 (e) Any person who has completed the full senior year of high
17 school and obtained a high school diploma, both at a Washington
18 public high school or private high school approved under chapter
19 28A.195 RCW, or a person who has received the equivalent of a
20 diploma; who has lived in Washington for at least three years
21 immediately prior to receiving the diploma or its equivalent; who has
22 continuously lived in the state of Washington after receiving the
23 diploma or its equivalent and until such time as the individual is
24 admitted to an institution of higher education under subsection (1)
25 of this section; and who provides to the institution an affidavit
26 indicating that the individual will file an application to become a
27 permanent resident at the earliest opportunity the individual is
28 eligible to do so and a willingness to engage in any other activities
29 necessary to acquire citizenship, including but not limited to
30 citizenship or civics review courses;

31 (f) Any person who has lived in Washington, primarily for
32 purposes other than educational, for at least one year immediately
33 before the date on which the person has enrolled in an institution,
34 and who holds lawful nonimmigrant status pursuant to 8 U.S.C. Sec.
35 (a)(15) (E)(iii), (H)(i), or (L), or who holds lawful nonimmigrant
36 status as the spouse or child of a person having nonimmigrant status
37 under one of those subsections, or who, holding or having previously
38 held such lawful nonimmigrant status as a principal or derivative,
39 has filed an application for adjustment of status pursuant to 8
40 U.S.C. Sec. 1255(a);

1 (g) A student who is on active military duty stationed in the
2 state or who is a member of the Washington national guard;

3 (h) A student who is on active military duty or a member of the
4 national guard who entered service as a Washington resident and who
5 has maintained Washington as his or her domicile but is not stationed
6 in the state;

7 (i) A student who is the spouse or a dependent of a person who is
8 on active military duty or a member of the national guard who entered
9 service as a Washington resident and who has maintained Washington as
10 his or her domicile but is not stationed in the state. If the person
11 on active military duty is reassigned out-of-state, the student
12 maintains the status as a resident student so long as the student is
13 continuously enrolled in a degree program;

14 (j) A student who resides in the state of Washington and is the
15 spouse or a dependent of a person who is a member of the Washington
16 national guard;

17 ~~(k)(i)(A) A student who ((has separated from the military under
18 honorable conditions after at least two years of service, and who
19 enters)):~~

20 (I) Has separated from the uniformed services with any period of
21 honorable service after at least ninety days of active duty service;

22 (II) Is eligible for benefits under the federal all-volunteer
23 force educational assistance program (38 U.S.C. Sec. 3001 et seq.),
24 the federal post-9/11 veterans educational assistance act of 2008 (38
25 U.S.C. Sec. 3301 et seq.), or any other federal law authorizing
26 educational assistance benefits for veterans; and

27 (III) Enters an institution of higher education in Washington
28 within ~~((one))~~ three years of the date of separation ~~((who:~~

29 ~~(i) At the time of separation designated Washington as his or her
30 intended domicile; or~~

31 ~~(ii) Has Washington as his or her official home of record; or~~

32 ~~(iii) Moves to Washington and establishes a domicile as
33 determined in RCW 28B.15.013;~~

34 ~~(l) A student who is the spouse or a dependent of an individual
35 who has separated from the military under honorable conditions after
36 at least two years of service who:~~

37 ~~(i) At the time of discharge designates Washington as his or her
38 intended domicile; and~~

39 ~~(ii) Has Washington as his or her primary domicile as determined
40 in RCW 28B.15.013; and~~

1 ~~(iii) Enters an institution of higher education in Washington~~
2 ~~within one year of the date of discharge)); or~~

3 (B) A student who is a spouse, former spouse, or child, and is
4 entitled to veterans administration educational benefits based on
5 their relationship to an individual who has separated from the
6 uniformed services with any period of honorable service after at
7 least ninety days of active duty service, and who enters an
8 institution of higher education in Washington within three years of
9 the date of separation; or

10 (C) A student who is entitled to veterans administration
11 educational benefits based on their relationship with a deceased
12 member of the uniformed services who completed at least ninety days
13 of active duty service and died in the line of duty, and the student
14 enters an institution of higher education in Washington within three
15 years of the service member's death;

16 (ii) A student who qualifies under (k)(i)(A) through (C) of this
17 subsection and who remains continuously enrolled at an institution of
18 higher education shall retain resident student status;

19 (iii) Nothing in this subsection (2)(k) applies to students who
20 have a dishonorable discharge from the uniformed services, or to
21 students who are the spouse or child of an individual who has had a
22 dishonorable discharge from the uniformed services, unless the
23 student is receiving veterans administration educational assistance
24 benefits;

25 ~~((+m))~~ (l) A student of an out-of-state institution of higher
26 education who is attending a Washington state institution of higher
27 education pursuant to a home tuition agreement as described in RCW
28 28B.15.725;

29 ~~((+n))~~ (m) A student who meets the requirements of RCW
30 28B.15.0131: PROVIDED, That a nonresident student enrolled for more
31 than six hours per semester or quarter shall be considered as
32 attending for primarily educational purposes, and for tuition and fee
33 paying purposes only such period of enrollment shall not be counted
34 toward the establishment of a bona fide domicile of one year in this
35 state unless such student proves that the student has in fact
36 established a bona fide domicile in this state primarily for purposes
37 other than educational;

38 ~~((+o))~~ (n) A student who resides in Washington and is on active
39 military duty stationed in the Oregon counties of Columbia, Gilliam,

1 Hood River, Multnomah, Clatsop, Clackamas, Morrow, Sherman, Umatilla,
2 Union, Wallowa, Wasco, or Washington; or

3 ~~((p))~~ (o) A student who resides in Washington and is the spouse
4 or a dependent of a person who resides in Washington and is on active
5 military duty stationed in the Oregon counties of Columbia, Gilliam,
6 Hood River, Multnomah, Clatsop, Clackamas, Morrow, Sherman, Umatilla,
7 Union, Wallowa, Wasco, or Washington. If the person on active
8 military duty moves from Washington or is reassigned out of the
9 Oregon counties of Columbia, Gilliam, Hood River, Multnomah, Clatsop,
10 Clackamas, Morrow, Sherman, Umatilla, Union, Wallowa, Wasco, or
11 Washington, the student maintains the status as a resident student so
12 long as the student resides in Washington and is continuously
13 enrolled in a degree program.

14 (3) The term "nonresident student" shall mean any student who
15 does not qualify as a "resident student" under the provisions of this
16 section and RCW 28B.15.013. Except for students qualifying under
17 subsection (2)(e) or ~~((m))~~ (l) of this section, a nonresident
18 student shall include:

19 (a) A student attending an institution with the aid of financial
20 assistance provided by another state or governmental unit or agency
21 thereof, such nonresidency continuing for one year after the
22 completion of such semester or quarter.

23 (b) A person who is not a citizen of the United States of America
24 who does not have permanent or temporary resident status or does not
25 hold "Refugee-Parolee" or "Conditional Entrant" status with the
26 United States citizenship immigration services or is not otherwise
27 permanently residing in the United States under color of law and who
28 does not also meet and comply with all the applicable requirements in
29 this section and RCW 28B.15.013.

30 (4) The term "domicile" shall denote a person's true, fixed and
31 permanent home and place of habitation. It is the place where the
32 student intends to remain, and to which the student expects to return
33 when the student leaves without intending to establish a new domicile
34 elsewhere. The burden of proof that a student, parent or guardian has
35 established a domicile in the state of Washington primarily for
36 purposes other than educational lies with the student.

37 (5) The term "dependent" shall mean a person who is not
38 financially independent. Factors to be considered in determining
39 whether a person is financially independent shall be set forth in
40 rules adopted by the student achievement council and shall include,

1 but not be limited to, the state and federal income tax returns of
2 the person and/or the student's parents or legal guardian filed for
3 the calendar year prior to the year in which application is made and
4 such other evidence as the council may require.

5 (6) The term "active military duty" means the person is serving
6 on active duty in:

7 (a) The armed forces of the United States government; or

8 (b) The Washington national guard; or

9 (c) The coast guard, merchant mariners, or other nonmilitary
10 organization when such service is recognized by the United States
11 government as equivalent to service in the armed forces.

12 (7) The term "active duty service" means full-time duty, other
13 than active duty for training, as a member of the uniformed service
14 of the United States. Active duty service as a national guard member
15 under Title 32 U.S.C. for the purpose of organizing, administering,
16 recruiting, instructing, or training and active service under 32
17 U.S.C. Sec. 502(f) for the purpose of responding to a national
18 emergency is recognized as active duty service.

19 (8) The term "uniformed services" is defined by Title 10 U.S.C.;
20 subsequently structured and organized by Titles 14, 33, and 42
21 U.S.C.; consisting of the United States army, United States marine
22 corps, United States navy, United States air force, United States
23 coast guard, United States public health service commissioned corps,
24 and the national oceanic and atmospheric administration commissioned
25 officer corps.

26 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate
27 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of
28 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes
29 effect July 1, 2015.

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
