1 AN ACT Relating to providing funding for steelhead conservation
2 through the issuance of Washington's fish license plate collection;
3 amending RCW 46.68.425; reenacting and amending RCW 46.18.200,
4 46.17.220, and 77.12.170; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW;
5 and providing an effective date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.18.200 and 2014 c 77 s 1 and 2014 c 6 s 1 are
8 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

9 (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the
10 department:

11 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized
12 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license
13 plates unless otherwise specified;

14 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the
15 department;

16 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter
17 46.87 RCW; and

18 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

19 (2) The department approves and shall issue the following special
20 license plates:

10 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
 11 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
 12 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
 13 state council of firefighters.

14 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license
 15 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten
 16 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)
 17 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate
 18 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting
 19 service before ten years of service have been completed, the
 20 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the
 21 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer
 22 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,
 23 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter
 24 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will
 25 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying
 26 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates
 27 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their
 28 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a
 29 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be
 30 surrendered upon conviction.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04
 32 RCW to read as follows:

33 "Washington's fish license plate collection" means the collection
 34 of fish license plate designs. Each license plate design displays a
 35 distinct symbol or artwork, to include steelhead, recognizing the
 36 fish of Washington.

1 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2014 c 77 s 2 and 2014 c 6 s 2 are
2 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

3 (1) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon
4 application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the
5 holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special
6 license plate fee as listed in this section.

17 (2) After deducting administration and collection expenses for
18 the sale of baseball stadium license plates, the remaining proceeds
19 must be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the
20 principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to
21 construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including
22 reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being
23 collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer
24 shall credit the funds to the state general fund.

25 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.68.425 and 2014 c 77 s 3 are each amended to read
26 as follows:

27 (1) The department shall:

28 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW
29 46.17.220;

30 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial
31 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and
32 collection expenses incurred by it; and

33 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state
34 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

1 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor
 2 vehicle fund until the department determines that the state has been
 3 reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license plate.
 4 Upon determination by the department that the state has been
 5 reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special
 6 license plate fees to the following accounts by special license plate
 7 type:

11 **Sec. 5.** RCW 77.12.170 and 2011 c 339 s 3, 2011 c 320 s 23, and
12 2011 c 171 s 112 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

13 (1) There is established in the state treasury the state wildlife
14 account which consists of moneys received from:

- 15 (a) Rentals or concessions of the department;
- 16 (b) The sale of real or personal property held for department
17 purposes, unless the property is seized or recovered through a fish,
18 shellfish, or wildlife enforcement action;
- 19 (c) The assessment of administrative penalties;
- 20 (d) The sale of licenses, permits, tags, and stamps required by
21 chapter 77.32 RCW, RCW 77.65.490, and application fees;
- 22 (e) Fees for informational materials published by the department;
- 23 (f) Fees for personalized vehicle, Wild on Washington, and
24 Endangered Wildlife license plates (~~and~~), Washington's Wildlife
25 license plate collection, and Washington's fish license plate
26 collection as provided in chapter 46.17 RCW;
- 27 (g) Articles or wildlife sold by the director under this title;
- 28 (h) Compensation for damage to department property or wildlife
29 losses or contributions, gifts, or grants received under RCW
30 77.12.320. However, this excludes fish and shellfish overages, and
31 court-ordered restitution or donations associated with any fish,
32 shellfish, or wildlife enforcement action, as such moneys must be
33 deposited pursuant to RCW 77.15.425;
- 34 (i) Excise tax on anadromous game fish collected under chapter
35 82.27 RCW;
- 36 (j) The department's share of revenues from auctions and raffles
37 authorized by the commission;

1 (k) The sale of watchable wildlife decals under RCW 77.32.560;
2 ((and))

3 (1) Moneys received from the recreation access pass account
4 created in RCW 79A.80.090 must be dedicated to stewardship,
5 operations, and maintenance of department lands used for public
6 recreation purposes; and

7 (m) Donations received by the director under RCW 77.12.039.

8 (2) State and county officers receiving any moneys listed in
9 subsection (1) of this section shall deposit them in the state
10 treasury to be credited to the state wildlife account.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6.** This act takes effect January 1, 2017.
