- 2 administrators; and amending RCW 29A.04.530 and 36.22.230.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 29A.04.530 and 2009 c 415 s 8 are each amended to read as follows:
- 6 (1) The secretary of state shall:
- 7 (((1))) <u>(a)</u> Establish and operate, or provide by contract, 8 training and certification programs for state and county elections 9 administration officials and personnel, including training on 10 election laws, the various types of election law violations, and 11 discrimination;
- $((\frac{(2)}{2}))$ (b) Administer tests for state and county officials and personnel who have received such training and issue certificates to those who have successfully completed the training and passed such tests;
- 16 $((\frac{3}{3}))$ <u>(c)</u> Maintain a record of those individuals who have 17 received such training and certificates; and
- 18 $((\frac{4}{1}))$ (d) Provide the staffing and support services required by the board created under RCW 29A.04.510.
- 20 <u>(2) Elections professionals meeting the qualifications in</u> 21 <u>subsection (3) of this section may participate in training and</u>

- 1 certificate programs and testing administered by the secretary of state. The secretary may not require additional qualifications for 2

- (3) For the purposes of this section, "elections professional" 4 5 means a person:
 - (a) Having two or more years of experience in:
- 7 (i) Election law;
- (ii) Election administration; 8
- (iii) Election campaigning or consulting; 9
- (iv) Membership on an elections canvassing board; 10
- (v) Service as an elected precinct committee officer or elections 11 12 observer for a major political party as defined in RCW 29A.04.086;
- (vi) Service as a local, state, or federal elected official; or 13
- (vii) Employment as full-time professional staff to a local, 14
- state, or federal elected official; 15
- (b) Who has successfully completed college coursework in 16 17 elections administration or a closely related subject at accredited institution of higher education;

- 19 (c) Who is a Washington state resident and has proof of certification from another state; or 20
- 21 (d) Who is a Washington state resident and presents a compelling petition to the secretary for inclusion in the training and 22
- certificate programs administered by the secretary. 23
- 24 (4) The secretary of state must keep the costs of training and
- 25 certificate programs and testing competitive and comparable to other
- 26 states and accredited programs.
- 27 **Sec. 2.** RCW 36.22.230 and 1992 c 163 s 13 are each amended to 28 read as follows:
- (1) Each deputy or assistant appointed under RCW 36.22.220 shall 29
- 30 have been graduated from an accredited high school or shall have
- 31 passed a high school equivalency examination. Each shall
- knowledgeable in the rules and laws of conducting elections. 32
- (2) For the purposes of this section, "knowledgeable in the rules 33
- and laws of conducting elections" means an elections professional as 34
- 35 defined in RCW 29A.04.530.
