1 AN ACT Relating to Washington farmers and ranchers special
2 license plates; amending RCW 46.68.420; reenacting and amending RCW
3 46.18.200, 46.17.220, and 46.18.060; adding a new section to chapter
4 46.04 RCW; and providing an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.18.200 and 2014 c 77 s 1 and 2014 c 6 s 1 are
7 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

8 (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the
9 department:

10 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized
11 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license
12 plates unless otherwise specified;

13 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the
14 department;

15 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter
16 46.87 RCW; and

17 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

18 (2) The department approves and shall issue the following special
19 license plates:

12 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license
13 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten
14 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)
15 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate
16 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting
17 service before ten years of service have been completed, the
18 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the
19 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer
20 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,
21 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter
22 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will
23 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying
24 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates
25 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their
26 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a
27 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be
28 surrendered upon conviction.

29 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2014 c 77 s 2 and 2014 c 6 s 2 are
30 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

31 (1) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon
32 application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the
33 holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special
34 license plate fee as listed in this section.

11 (2) After deducting administration and collection expenses for
12 the sale of baseball stadium license plates, the remaining proceeds
13 must be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the
14 principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to
15 construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including
16 reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being
17 collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer
18 shall credit the funds to the state general fund.

19 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2014 c 6 s 3 are each amended to read
20 as follows:

- 21 (1) The department shall:
- 22 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW
23 46.17.220;
- 24 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial
25 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and
26 collection expenses incurred by it; and
- 27 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state
28 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.
- 29 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor
30 vehicle account until the department determines that the state has
31 been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license
32 plate. Upon determination by the department that the state has been
33 reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special
34 license plate fee amounts for each special license plate to the
35 following appropriate account as created in this section in the
36 custody of the state treasurer:

7 (3) Only the director or the director's designee may authorize
8 expenditures from the accounts described in subsection (2) of this
9 section. The accounts are subject to allotment procedures under
10 chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for
11 expenditures.

12 (4) Funds in the special license plate accounts described in
13 subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the
14 conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under
15 contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations
16 that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this
17 section.

18 (5) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit
19 organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in
20 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status
21 under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization
22 must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

23 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.18.060 and 2014 c 77 s 5 and 2014 c 6 s 4 are
24 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

25 (1) The department must review and either approve or reject
26 special license plate applications submitted by sponsoring
27 organizations.

28 (2) Duties of the department include, but are not limited to, the
29 following:

30 (a) Review and approve the annual financial reports submitted by
31 sponsoring organizations with active special license plate series and
32 present those annual financial reports to the joint transportation
33 committee;

34 (b) Report annually to the joint transportation committee on the
35 special license plate applications that were considered by the
36 department;

37 (c) Issue approval and rejection notification letters to
38 sponsoring organizations, the executive committee of the joint

1 transportation committee, and the legislative sponsors identified in
2 each application. The letters must be issued within seven days of
3 making a determination on the status of an application; and

4 (d) Review annually the number of plates sold for each special
5 license plate series created after January 1, 2003. The department
6 may submit a recommendation to discontinue a special plate series to
7 the executive committee of the joint transportation committee.

8 (3) In order to assess the effects and impact of the
9 proliferation of special license plates, the legislature declares a
10 temporary moratorium on the issuance of any additional plates until
11 July 1, 2015. During this period of time, the department is
12 prohibited from accepting, reviewing, processing, or approving any
13 applications. Additionally, a special license plate may not be
14 enacted by the legislature during the moratorium, unless the proposed
15 license plate has been approved by the former special license plate
16 review board before February 15, 2005.

17 (4) The limitations under subsection (3) of this section do not
18 apply to the following special license plates:

19 (a) 4-H license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;

20 (b) Breast cancer awareness license plates created under RCW
21 46.18.200;

22 (c) Gold star license plates created under RCW 46.18.245;

23 (d) Music Matters license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;

24 (e) Seattle Seahawks license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;

25 (f) Seattle Sounders FC license plates created under RCW
26 46.18.200;

27 (g) Seattle University license plates created under RCW
28 46.18.200;

29 (h) State flower license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;

30 (i) Volunteer firefighter license plates created under RCW
31 46.18.200;

32 (j) Washington farmers and ranchers license plates created under
33 RCW 46.18.200.

34 NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 46.04
35 RCW to read as follows:

36 "Washington farmers and ranchers license plates" means special
37 license plates issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display a symbol or
38 artwork recognizing Washington farmers and ranchers.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6.** This act takes effect January 1, 2017.
