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- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The medical quality assurance commission shall do a study of the effects of long-term antibiotic therapy on patients who have been diagnosed with posttreatment Lyme disease syndrome. The study should include a review of:
- 8 (a) The antibiotics that are commonly used, prescribed, and 9 administered for the long-term treatment of Lyme disease;
- 10 (b) The side effects associated with long-term antibiotic 11 therapy;
- 12 (c) The effectiveness of long-term antibiotic therapy of 13 controlling symptoms for patients who have posttreatment Lyme disease 14 syndrome;
 - (d) Whether allowing physicians in Washington state to administer long-term antibiotic therapy for treating Lyme disease would be beneficial to the health and safety of Washington residents; and
- 18 (e) Any other aspects of long-term antibiotic therapy that the 19 commission deems important for the health and safety of patients who 20 may receive these treatments.

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- 1 (2) The medical quality assurance commission shall report its 2 findings to the governor and the health care committees of the 3 legislature by December 1, 2015.
 - (3) This section expires July 1, 2016.

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
