- 18 WHEREAS, A team of Mill Creek Middle School students in Kent 19 collaborated with local architects Thomas Wadkins and Jason Romine to 20 design their futuristic school design submission; and
- WHEREAS, The Mill Creek Middle School team competed against teams from over twelve schools across the state with their design for a STEM career-focused school called West Lake Academy; and

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1 WHEREAS, Dana Piehl worked as the dedicated leader for the Mill 2 Creek Middle School team, providing logistical support for the 3 students; and
