1           WHEREAS, The Council of Educational Facility Planners  
2 International (CEFPI) is a worldwide professional association whose  
3 mission is to advocate for effective educational facilities for  
4 children; and  
5           WHEREAS, CEFPI hosts competitive local, national, and  
6 international events where teams of students present designs for  
7 their "School of the Future," drawing national attention to the  
8 importance of well-planned, healthy, high-performance, safe, and  
9 sustainable schools; and  
10          WHEREAS, Competing teams must submit an electronic narrative,  
11 presentation, and video documenting the design, rationale, planning  
12 process, and ideas to a jury of architects and engineers; and  
13          WHEREAS, Students discover how to solve real-life problems as  
14 members of a design and planning team; and  
15          WHEREAS, Teams competing at the local and state levels may earn  
16 the opportunity to represent their state at the International  
17 Competition in the fall; and  
18          WHEREAS, A team of Mill Creek Middle School students in Kent  
19 collaborated with local architects Thomas Wadkins and Jason Romine to  
20 design their futuristic school design submission; and  
21          WHEREAS, The Mill Creek Middle School team competed against teams  
22 from over twelve schools across the state with their design for a  
23 STEM career-focused school called West Lake Academy; and  
24          WHEREAS, Dana Piehl worked as the dedicated leader for the Mill  
25 Creek Middle School team, providing logistical support for the  
26 students; and  
27          WHEREAS, On April 4, 2014, the Mill Creek Middle School team was  
28 named State Winners to represent the State of Washington in the  
29 Pacific Northwest Regional Competition, competing against teams from  
30 Alaska, Idaho, Oregon, as well as the provinces of Alberta, British  
31 Columbia, and Saskatchewan;  
32          NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize Daniel  
33 Anderson, Brooke Roshon, Adria Sutliff, Asia Tanis, and Jenna Yee for  
34 their pursuit of academic excellence and their vision for the future
