## SENATE RESOLUTION 8724

By Senators Hasegawa, Hobbs, Nelson, Brown, Pearson, Dansel, Becker, Conway, Rolfes, Dammeier, Jayapal, Keiser, Cleveland, Roach, Fraser, and Chase

- 1 WHEREAS, On February 19, 1942, President Franklin D. Roosevelt 2 issued Executive Order 9066 which authorized the military to forcibly 3 remove and incarcerate more than 120,000 persons of Japanese ancestry 4 from the West Coast, including 12,000 Japanese-American residents of 5 Washington State; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The first Civilian Evacuation Order gave Japanese7 Americans from Bainbridge Island less than one week to leave behind
  8 homes, personal belongings, farms, businesses, friends, and family
  9 and to report to hastily constructed detention centers like Camp
  10 Harmony on the grounds of the Western Washington Fair in Puyallup;
  11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, This drastic course of action allegedly aimed to prevent 13 acts of espionage and sabotage by Japanese-Americans who were deemed 14 untrustworthy and disloyal to the United States; and
- 15 WHEREAS, On March 23, 1943, the War Department organized a 16 segregated unit of Japanese-Americans, many of whom reported for 17 military duty from concentration camps surrounded by barbed wire in 18 which they and their families were detained; and
- 19 WHEREAS, More than 12,000 volunteers responded to questions of 20 their loyalty and patriotism by amassing a battle record unparalleled 21 in United States military history; and
- WHEREAS, Equally loyal and patriotic Japanese-Americans fought to protect our constitutional rights and liberties through dissent, like

University of Washington student Gordon Hirabayashi who was 1 2 arrested, convicted, and imprisoned for defying the military 3 curfew on select civilians and refusing to evacuate when ordered; and

- 5 WHEREAS, In 1982, the Congressional Commission on Wartime 6 Relocation and Internment of Civilians found "no military or 7 security reason for the internment" of persons of Japanese 8 ancestry, but determined it "was caused by racial prejudice, war 9 hysteria, and a failure of political leadership"; and
- 10 WHEREAS, As a result of this travesty of justice, Japanese-11 Americans suffered immense economic loss of property and assets, 12 immeasurable physical and psychological harm, and were deprived 13 of their constitutional liberties without due process of law; 14 and
- WHEREAS, In 1976, President Gerald Ford rescinded Executive 15 16 Order 9066 calling upon the American people to "resolve that 17 this kind of action shall never again be repeated"; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Washington State Legislature enacted token 19 compensatory redress to forty state workers who lost their jobs due to their incarceration; and 20
- 21 WHEREAS, Congressman Lowry Mike of Washington 22 introduced H.R. 5977 to provide reparations and an apology to 23 former Japanese-American internees, thus initiating a ten-year 24 legislative quest that ended when President Ronald Reagan signed the Civil Liberties Act of 1988; and 25
  - WHEREAS, General Douglas MacArthur's chief of intelligence claimed, "The Nisei saved a million lives and shortened the war by two years";
  - NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Washington State Senate pause to acknowledge the seventy-fourth anniversary of the signing of Executive Order 9066, to recognize and honor the heroism, sacrifice, patience, and loyalty of the Japanese-American World War II veterans, internees, and civil rights activists, and to remember the lessons and blessings of liberty and justice for all; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be 36 37 immediately transmitted by the Secretary of the Senate to the
