2 appropriation for fiscal year 2018 by \$6,200,000

9 On page 87, after line 4, insert the following:

10 "(xxxxiv) The authority may not provide benefits or services to
11 permit a woman to voluntarily terminate her pregnancy, except when
12 the abortion is medically necessary, which means that, as determined
13 by reasonable, good faith clinical judgement of the patient's
14 primary care physician, the life of the woman seeking the abortion
15 is in imminent danger because of a serious physical disorder,
16 illness, or injury if the abortion is not performed."

1 On page 113, after line 3, insert the following:

2 "(33) The department may not provide benefits or services to
3 permit a woman to voluntarily terminate her pregnancy, except when
4 the abortion is medically necessary, which means that, as determined
5 by reasonable, good faith clinical judgement of the patient's
6 primary care physician, the life of the woman seeking the abortion
7 is in imminent danger because of a serious physical disorder,
8 illness, or injury if the abortion is not performed.

9 (34) \$3,700,000 of the general fund-state appropriation for
10 fiscal year 2018 and \$3,700,000 of the general fund-state
11 appropriation for fiscal year 2019 are provided solely to support
12 organizations that provide breast and cervical cancer screenings at
13 the county level. None of these amounts may be provided to
14 organizations that perform abortions."

26 provided solely for expenditure into the sexual assault prevention

28 House Bill No. 1109 (victims of sexual assault). If the bill is not
29 enacted by June, 30, 2017, the amount in this section is
30 appropriated to the office of the attorney general for the sexual
31 assault kit initiative pilot project as described in Engrossed
32 Substitute House Bill No. 1109 (victims of sexual assault)."

5 "Sec.962. RCW 66.08.2601 and 2015 3rd sp.s. c 26 s 1 are each
6 amended to read as follows:

7 (1) A nonrefundable additional fee is imposed on all
8 applications and renewals of licenses and permits relating to
9 spirits, wine, and beer required under chapters 66.20 and 66.24 RCW,
10 with the exception of license issuance fees of seventeen percent of
11 revenues owed by spirits retail licensees under RCW 66.24.630(4)(a),
12 and the five to ten percent license issuance fee for spirits
13 distributors under RCW 66.24.055(3). The fee applies to all
14 applications and license modifications received on or after *the
15 effective date of this section and renewals where the date of
16 license expiration is on or after June 30, 2015. The fee is equal to
17 six and two tenths percent of the licensing or permit fee due under
18 chapters 66.20 and 66.24 RCW. If the fee is not a whole dollar
19 amount, the fee must be rounded up to the next whole dollar. This
20 section expires June 30, 2017.

21 (2) This section expires June 30, 2017."

EFFECT: Prohibits the Medical Assistance program in the Health
Care Authority and the Reproductive Health and Wellness program in
the Department of Health (DOH) from paying for abortions that are
not deemed medically necessary by the patient's primary care
physician. Funding for those programs is reduced by \$12,400,000
General Fund-State in the 2017-19 biennium.

Funding for the DOH to support organizations that provide breast and
cervical cancer screenings at the county level is increased by
\$7,400,000 in the 2017-19 biennium. Prohibits any of these funds

from going to organizations that perform abortions.

Funding for the Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Account established in Engrossed Substitute House Bill No. 1109 (victims of sexual assault) is increased by \$5,000,000 for the 2017-19 biennium. Should the bill not be enacted by June 30, 2017, the amounts are appropriated to the Office Of the Attorney General to implement the Sexual Assault Kit Initiative Pilot Project described in Engrossed Substitute House Bill No. 1109.

The expiration date for the 6.2 percent fee on liquor licenses and permits issued by the Liquor and Cannabis Board extended under Engrossed Substitute House Bill No. 1109 is reverted back to current law (expiring on June 30, 2017).

FISCAL IMPACT: No net change to appropriated levels.

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
