28 received by the office of lieutenant governor, at least ninety
29 percent must be applied towards services directly provided to youth
30 participants.

32 On page 8, after line 36 of the amendment, insert the following:

33 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 43.15
34 RCW to read as follows:

35 (1) The sports mentoring program is established to enable
36 eligible nonprofit community-based organizations to provide
37 opportunities for underserved youth to join sports teams or otherwise

1 participate in the area of sports. The goal of the program is to
2 support youth in building self-confidence, developing skills in the
3 areas of goal setting and collaboration, and promoting a healthy
4 lifestyle through forming positive relationships with peers and
5 family, avoiding risky or delinquent behavior, and achieving
6 educational success. Proceeds from the Seattle Mariners special
7 license plate, issued under RCW 46.18.200, must be deposited into the
8 Seattle Mariners account in accordance with RCW 46.68.420. Funds in
9 the account may only be used, except as provided under RCW
10 46.68.420(6), for grants to support youth to stay in school,
11 participate in sports, and receive mentorships.

12 (2) The office of lieutenant governor will collaborate with the
13 association of Washington generals to issue competitive grants to
14 eligible organizations. The following criteria must be used to
15 prioritize applications:

16 (a) Services provided by the organization to program participants
17 are provided without a fee;

18 (b) Eligible organizations must assist children with enrolling in
19 sports through their parents, guardians, or coach; and

20 (c) Eligible organizations must provide professional staff
21 support to the mentor, child, and parent.

22 (3) Eligible organizations must meet the following requirements:

23 (a) Be a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization;

24 (b) Conduct national criminal background checks for all employees
25 and volunteer mentors who work with children;

26 (c) Have adopted standards for care including staff training,
27 health and safety standards, and mechanisms for assessing and
28 enforcing the program's compliance with the standards adopted;

29 (d) Ensure that sixty percent or more of the children they serve
30 are eligible for free or reduced-price lunch;

31 (e) Provide free, direct services to children through volunteer
32 mentoring; and

33 (f) Provide professional oversight of all mentoring relationships
34 for each child served.

35 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2017 c 25 s 2 and 2017 c 11 s 3 are
36 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

37 ((+1)) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid
38 upon application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW,

1 the holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate
 2 special license plate fee as listed in this section.

~~((2) After deducting administration and collection expenses for the sale of baseball stadium license plates, the remaining proceeds must be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds to the state general fund.))~~

Sec. 5. RCW 46.18.200 and 2017 c 25 s 1 and 2017 c 11 s 2 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

(1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the department:

(a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license plates unless otherwise specified;

(b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the department;

(c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter 46.87 RCW; and

(d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

(2) The department approves and shall issue the following special license plates:

LICENSE PLATE	DESCRIPTION, SYMBOL, OR ARTWORK
4-H	Displays the "4-H" logo.
Armed forces collection	Recognizes the contribution of veterans, active duty military personnel, reservists, and members of the national guard, and includes six separate designs, each containing a symbol representing a different branch of the armed forces to include army, navy, air force, marine corps, coast guard, and national guard.

23 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
24 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
25 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
26 state council of firefighters.

27 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license
28 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten
29 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)
30 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate
31 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting
32 service before ten years of service have been completed, the
33 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the
34 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer
35 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,
36 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter
37 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will
38 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying

1 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates
2 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their
3 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a
4 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be
5 surrendered upon conviction.

6 **Sec. 6.** RCW 46.68.430 and 2010 c 161 s 811 are each amended to
7 read as follows:

8 (1) The department shall:

9 (a) Collect special license plates fees established under RCW
10 46.17.220(~~((1)-(e) and (e))~~) (6);

11 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial
12 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and
13 collection expenses incurred by it; and

14 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state
15 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

16 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the remaining special
17 license plate fees to the following accounts by special license plate

3 RCW to read as follows:

4 "Seattle Mariners license plates" means special license plates
5 issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display a symbol or artwork
6 recognizing the Seattle Mariners.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8.** The following acts or parts of acts are
8 each repealed:

9 (1) RCW 46.04.062 (Baseball stadium license plate) and 2010 c 161
10 s 105; and

11 (2) RCW 46.18.215 (Baseball stadium license plates) and 2011 c
12 332 s 3, 2010 c 161 s 614, 1997 c 291 s 5, 1995 3rd sp.s. c 1 s 102,
13 1994 c 194 s 2, & 1990 c 250 s 1.

14 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 9.** Sections 3 through 8 of this act take
15 effect January 1, 2019."

16 Correct the title.

EFFECT: (1) Expands the purpose of the Association of Washington
Generals to include expanding sports opportunities for youth,
veterans, and people with disabilities.

(2) Provides that the Office of the Lieutenant Governor will
collaborate with the Association of Washington Generals in the
administration of the sports mentoring program.

(3) Creates a sports mentoring program and requires 75 percent of
the Seattle Mariners license plate fees to fund the sports mentoring
program, with at least 90 percent of the amounts received to be
applied towards services directly provided to youth participants in
the sports mentoring program.

(4) Establishes the Seattle Mariners special license plate,
creates the Seattle Mariners account, and requires the allocation of
the proceeds received through the Seattle Mariners special license
plates as follows: 75 percent to the Office of the Lieutenant
Governor solely for the administration of the sports mentoring
program, and 25 percent to the Office of Lieutenant Governor solely
for the administration of the Washington World Fellows Program.

(5) Repeals and removes the baseball stadium license plate
provisions in statute.

(6) Requires that the annual financial report include details of
revenues and expenditures associated with the sports mentoring
program.

(7) Makes the provisions relating to the sports mentoring program and the Seattle Mariners special license plate effective January 1, 2019.
