- We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully represent and petition as follows:
- 7 WHEREAS, The Bonneville Power Administration operates and 8 maintains over fifteen thousand circuit miles of transmission line, 9 known as interties, across the western United States, including 10 Washington state; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Bonneville Power Administration has recognized its 12 role in encouraging the development of renewable resources within the 13 Pacific Northwest; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The Montana intertie segment of the eastern intertie, 15 which stretches across the state of Montana and into the state of 16 Washington, was originally built and paid for in part by Washington 17 utilities to provide transmission services for coal-fired generating 18 facilities located in southeastern Montana; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The Montana intertie also provides transmission services 20 for renewable energy resources that are vital to the decarbonization 21 of the electric sector and the energy independence of the Pacific 22 Northwest; and

1 WHEREAS, There is an existing one hundred eighty-four megawatts 2 of unsubscribed transmission capacity in the Montana intertie, which is expected to grow in the next five years; and 3

WHEREAS, The closure of Colstrip Units 1 and 2 by 2022 will further free up transmission capacity for new or expanded clean and renewable energy resources from Montana into Washington state, thereby providing access to resources that can help Washington meet its renewable energy and greenhouse gas reduction goals; and

WHEREAS, Public utilities would transmit energy between many 9 existing and proposed renewable energy resources and the Bonneville 10 11 Power Administration's eastern intertie; and

WHEREAS, The economic health of the state of Montana directly impacts the economic well-being of the state of Washington; and 13

WHEREAS, The existing transmission rate charged by the Bonneville Power Administration of two dollars per megawatt is a barrier to new investment in energy generation resources in Montana; and

WHEREAS, The transmission rate is only applied to one segment of less than one hundred miles out of a fifteen thousand mile system, in an area that is in the most need of new energy resources investment; and

21 WHEREAS, Reduction or elimination of transmission costs will promote the development of new energy and capacity resources in an 22 area of Montana that is experiencing losses in energy and capacity 24 resources;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the Bonneville Power Administration consider a rate design for the eastern intertie that eliminates or reduces the transmission rate associated with that part of the eastern intertie known as the Montana intertie.

BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately 30 31 transmitted to Elliot Mainzer, Bonneville Power Administration Lead 32 Administrator and the Secretary of the United States Department of 33 Energy.
