## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5228

- 1 AN ACT Relating to establishing the joint legislative task force
- 2 on hydraulic project approval program jurisdiction; creating a new
- 3 section; and providing an expiration date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1)(a) A joint legislative task force on
- 6 hydraulic project approval program jurisdiction is established, with
- 7 members as provided in this subsection.
- 8 (i) The president of the senate must appoint one member from each
- 9 of the two largest caucuses of the senate.
- 10 (ii) The speaker of the house of representatives must appoint one
- 11 member from each of the two largest caucuses of the house of
- 12 representatives.
- 13 (iii) The legislative members must appoint additional members
- 14 representing stakeholders including, but not limited to, business,
- 15 local government, agricultural, and conservation interests, and
- 16 request representation from tribal governments.
- 17 (iv) The director of fish and wildlife, or the director's
- 18 designee, must serve as a member.
- 19 (b) The task force must choose cochairs from among its
- 20 legislative membership. The legislative members must convene the
- 21 initial meeting of the task force.

- (2) The task force must review current law, current and historical practices of the department of fish and wildlife, and alternative approaches concerning the extent of hydraulic project approval program jurisdiction.
- (3) Staff support for the task force must be provided by senate committee services and the house of representatives office of program research. The department of fish and wildlife must cooperate with the task force and provide information as the task force may reasonably request.
- (4) Legislative members of the task force are reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW 44.04.120. Nonlegislative members are not entitled to be reimbursed for travel expenses if they are elected officials or are participating on behalf of an employer, governmental entity, or other organization. Any reimbursement for other nonlegislative members is subject to chapter 43.03 RCW.
- (5) The expenses of the task force must be paid jointly by the senate and the house of representatives. Task force expenditures are subject to approval by the senate facilities and operations committee and the house of representatives executive rules committee, or their successor committees.
- (6) The task force must provide a brief summary of its work and any recommendations to the appropriate committees of the legislature by October 1, 2017.
  - (7) This section expires June 30, 2018.
