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## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5746

State of Washington 65th Legislature 2018 Regular Session

By Senate State Government, Tribal Relations & Elections (originally sponsored by Senators Kuderer and Pearson; by request of Lieutenant Governor)

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the association of Washington generals;
- amending RCW 43.15.030; and reenacting and amending RCW 46.68.420.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.15.030 and 2005 c 69 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) The association of Washington generals is organized as a private, nonprofit, nonpartisan( $(\tau)$ ) corporation in accordance with chapter 24.03 RCW and this section.
  - (2) The purpose of the association of Washington generals is to:
- 10 (a) Provide the state a means of extending formal recognition for 11 an individual's outstanding services to the state; ((and))
- 12 (b) Bring together those individuals to serve the state as 13 ambassadors of trade, tourism, and international goodwill; and
- (c) Expand educational and/or employment opportunities for youth,
  veterans, and people with disabilities in Washington state.
- 16 (3) The association of Washington generals may conduct activities 17 in support of their mission, including but not limited to:
- 18 (a) Establishing selection criteria for selecting Washington 19 generals;

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- 1 (b) Operating a statewide ((essay competition)) study abroad and college readiness fellowship called the Washington world fellows program;
  - (c) Training Washington generals as ambassadors of the state of Washington, nationally and internationally; and
- 6 (d) Promoting Washington generals as ambassadors of the state of Washington.
- 8 (4) The association of Washington generals is governed by a board 9 of directors. The board is composed of the governor, lieutenant 10 governor, and the secretary of state, who serve as ex officio, 11 nonvoting members, and other officers and members as the association 12 of Washington generals designates.
- (5) Members of the board are compensated in accordance with RCW 43.03.220 and are reimbursed for their travel expenses in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.
  - (6) The board shall:

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- 17 (a) Review nominations for and be responsible for the selection 18 of Washington generals; and
- 19 (b) Establish the title of honorary Washington general to honor 20 worthy individuals from outside the state of Washington.
- $((\frac{5}{}))$  The lieutenant governor's office may provide technical and financial assistance for the association of Washington generals.
- (((6))) (8) The legislature may make appropriations in support of the Washington generals subject to the availability of funds.
- 26 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2017 c 25 s 3 and 2017 c 11 s 4 are 27 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 28 (1) The department shall:
- 29 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW 30 46.17.220;
- 31 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial 32 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and 33 collection expenses incurred by it; and
- 34 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state 35 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.
- 36 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor 37 vehicle account until the department determines that the state has 38 been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license 39 plate. Upon determination by the department that the state has been

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reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special license plate fee amounts for each special license plate to the following appropriate account as created in this section in the custody of the state treasurer:

7	Washington tennis	Provide funds to cities to assist in
8		the construction and maintenance
9		of a public tennis facility with at
10		least four indoor tennis courts. A
11		city is eligible for construction
12		funds if the city does not already
13		have a public or private facility
14		with at least four indoor tennis
15		courts. Funds for construction
16		must first be made available to the
17		most populous eligible city,
18		according to the most recent
19		census, for a time period not to
20		exceed five years after January 1,
21		2017. After the five-year time
22		period, the funds for construction
23		must be made available to the
24		next most populous eligible city.
25		Funds for the maintenance of a
26		public tennis facility with at least
27		four indoor tennis courts must
28		first be made available to the first
29		eligible city that utilizes funds for
30		construction provided by chapter
31		16, Laws of 2016

- (3) Only the director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.
- (4) Funds in the special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this section.
- (5) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

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
