- AN ACT Relating to establishing pilot programs to plan for the 1 2 needs of certain college students experiencing homelessness; adding a
- new section to chapter 28B.50 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 3
- 28B.77 RCW; and providing expiration dates. 4
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON: 5
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28B.50 7 RCW to read as follows:
- (1) The college board must establish a pilot program to encourage 8 9 college districts to plan for the unique needs and challenges of students experiencing homelessness. Such accommodations may include, 10 11 limited to: Laundry facilities, storage, showers, 12 encouraging culinary programs to provide free or reduced-price meals, 13 and providing short-term housing or housing assistance; and plans to 14 develop surplus property for affordable housing to accommodate the needs of students experiencing homelessness. The pilot program must 15 16 include four college districts, two on each side of the Cascade 17 mountain range. The pilot program expires July 1, 2023. The college 18 districts that participate in the pilot program must provide a joint report to the appropriate committees of the legislature by December 19 1, 2023, that includes at least the following information: The number 20 of students experiencing homelessness during the pilot program, the

- 1 number of students assisted, strategies for accommodating students
- 2 experiencing homelessness, and legislative recommendations.
- 3 (2) This section expires January 1, 2024.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.77 5 RCW to read as follows:
- (1) The council must establish a pilot program to encourage four-6 year institutions of higher education to plan for the unique needs 7 challenges of students experiencing homelessness. 8 9 accommodations may include, but are not limited to: Laundry facilities, storage, showers, encouraging culinary programs 10 11 provide free or reduced-price meals, and providing short-term housing 12 or housing assistance; and plans to develop surplus property for 13 affordable housing to accommodate the needs of students experiencing homelessness. The pilot program must include two 14 four-year 15 institutions of higher education, one on each side of the Cascade 16 mountain range. The pilot program expires July 1, 2023. The four-year 17 institutions of higher education that participate in the pilot program must provide a joint report to the appropriate committees of 18 19 the legislature by December 1, 2023, that includes at least the 20 following information: The number of students experiencing 21 homelessness during the pilot program, the number of students assisted, strategies for accommodating students experiencing 22 23 homelessness, and legislative recommendations.
 - (2) This section expires January 1, 2024.
