## SENATE BILL 6280

- AN ACT Relating to issuing an identicard for offenders released from prison facilities; amending RCW 46.20.117; adding a new section
- 3 to chapter 72.09 RCW; creating new sections; and providing ar
- 4 effective date.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- $\,$  6  $\,$  NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature intends to create an
- 7 identicard program to assist incarcerated offenders obtain a state-
- 8 issued identicard to aid and prepare offenders for release from
- 9 prison and reentry into the community. The legislature finds that
- 10 each step that assists individuals being released from prisons helps
- 11 incarcerated offenders avoid predictable conditions that lead to
- 12 future recidivism. In accordance with the governor's executive order
- 13 No. 16-05, "Building Safe and Strong Communities through Successful
- 14 Reentry," this act intends to ensure that offenders released from
- 15 state prisons have adequate identification in order to increase
- 16 public safety and reduce recidivism.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 72.09
- 18 RCW to read as follows:
- 19 (1) Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this
- 20 specific purpose, the department, working in conjunction with the

- 1 department of licensing, shall create and implement an identicard program to provide offenders released within Washington state a 2 state-issued identicard pursuant to RCW 46.20.117. 3
- An offender is eligible for an original, renewal, or 4 replacement identicard pursuant to this section, provided he or she: 5
- 6 (a) Meets the department of licensing criteria under RCW 7 46.20.117;
- (b) Is sentenced to the custody of the department of corrections, 8 9 and is incarcerated within a department of corrections facility with an earned release date that is more than one year from his or her 10 11 admission date;
- 12 (c) Is expected to be released to a location within Washington 13 state; and
- 14 (d) Does not have a current and valid state-issued identification 15 card.
- 16 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.20.117 and 2017 c 122 s 2 are each amended to 17 read as follows:
- **Issuance**. The department shall issue an 18 (1)identicard, 19 containing a picture, if the applicant:
- 20 (a)(i) Does not hold a valid Washington driver's license;
- $((\frac{b}{b}))$  (ii) Proves his or her identity as required by RCW 21 46.20.035; and 22
- 23 (((c))) (iii) Pays the required fee. Except as provided in 24 subsections (1)(b) or (5) of this section, the fee is fifty-four 25 dollars, unless an applicant is:  $((\frac{1}{2}))$  (A) A recipient continuing public assistance grants under Title 74 RCW, who is 26 referred in writing by the secretary of social and health services; 27 or ((<del>(ii)</del>)) (B) under the age of eighteen and does not have a permanent residence address as determined by the department by rule.
- 29 30 For those persons, the fee must be the actual cost of production of
- the identicard; or 31

- (b) Is eligible for issuance of an identicard under section 2 of 32 33 this act.
- (i) A valid identification card issued by the department of 34 35 corrections may serve as sufficient proof of identity and residency for an applicant under this subsection; 36
- (ii) An identicard issued under this subsection must expire two 37 years from the first anniversary of the offender's birthdate after 38

  2 fee of eighteen dollars for an identicard issued under this
  3 subsection.
  - (2)(a) **Design and term**. The identicard must:

- 5 (i) Be distinctly designed so that it will not be confused with 6 the official driver's license; and
  - (ii) Except as provided in subsections (1)(b) or (5) of this section, expire on the sixth anniversary of the applicant's birthdate after issuance.
- 10 (b) The identicard may include the person's status as a veteran, 11 consistent with RCW 46.20.161(2).
- 12 (3) **Renewal**. An application for identicard renewal may be 13 submitted by means of:
  - (a) Personal appearance before the department; or
- 15 (b) Mail or electronic commerce, if permitted by rule of the 16 department and if the applicant did not renew his or her identicard 17 by mail or by electronic commerce when it last expired.
  - An identicard may not be renewed by mail or by electronic commerce unless the renewal issued by the department includes a photograph of the identicard holder.
- 21 (4) **Cancellation**. The department may cancel an identicard if the 22 holder of the identicard used the card or allowed others to use the 23 card in violation of RCW 46.20.0921.
  - (5) Alternative issuance/renewal/extension. The department may issue or renew an identicard for a period other than six years, or may extend by mail or electronic commerce an identicard that has already been issued, in order to evenly distribute, as nearly as possible, the yearly renewal rate of identicard holders. The fee for an identicard issued or renewed for a period other than six years, or that has been extended by mail or electronic commerce, is nine dollars for each year that the identicard is issued, renewed, or extended. The department may adopt any rules as are necessary to carry out this subsection.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. The department of corrections and the department of licensing may enter into a memorandum of understanding to meet the requirements of this act, and have discretion to implement this act over a period of time not to exceed twelve months from the effective date of this act.
