1 AN ACT Relating to providing women with timely information
2 regarding their breast health; adding a new section to chapter 70.54
3 RCW; providing an effective date; and providing an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 70.54
6 RCW to read as follows:

7 (1) All health care facilities shall include in the summary of
8 the mammography report, required by federal law to be provided to a
9 patient, information that identifies the patient's individual breast
10 density classification based on the breast imaging reporting and data
11 system established by the American College of Radiology. If a
12 physician at, employed by, or under contract with, the health care
13 facility determines that a patient has heterogeneously or extremely
14 dense breasts, the summary of the mammography report must include the
15 following notice:

16 "Your mammogram indicates that you may have dense breast tissue.
17 Roughly half of all women have dense breast tissue which is normal.
18 Dense breast tissue may make it more difficult to evaluate your
19 mammogram. We are sharing this information with you and your health
20 care provider to help raise your awareness of breast density. We
21 encourage you to talk with your health care provider about this and

1 other breast cancer risk factors. Together, you can decide which
2 screening options are right for you."

3 (2) Patients who receive diagnostic or screening mammograms may
4 be directed to informative material about breast density. This
5 informative material may include the American College of Radiology's
6 most current brochure on the subject of breast density.

7 (3) This section does not create a duty of care for any health
8 care facility or any health care providers or other legal obligation
9 beyond the duty to provide notice as set forth in this section.

10 (4) This section does not require a notice that is inconsistent
11 with the provisions of the federal mammography quality standards act
12 (42 U.S.C. Sec. 263b) or any regulations adopted under that act.

13 (5) For the purposes of this section:

14 (a) "Health care facility" means a hospital, clinic, nursing
15 home, laboratory, office, or similar place where mammography
16 examinations are performed.

17 (b) "Physician" means a person licensed to practice medicine
18 under chapter 18.57 or 18.71 RCW.

19 (6) This section expires January 1, 2025.

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** Section 1 of this act takes effect January
21 1, 2019.

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
