- 15 WHEREAS, After hearing from victims that there were still 16 survivors, Dave and the Free Burma Rangers worked with a team of 17 American and Iraqi soldiers to rescue them; and
- WHEREAS, U.S. forces dropped smoke canisters to conceal Dave as 19 he ran through ISIS fire to save a young girl and bring her to 20 safety; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Photos and videos of the rescue have grabbed national 22 headlines, and show the bravery and courage humanitarians like Dave
