1 On page 4, after line 17, insert the following:

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3 "Sec. 4. RCW 28A.700.080 and 2019 c 252 s 116 are each amended
4 to read as follows:

5 (1) Subject to funds appropriated for this purpose, the office
6 of the superintendent of public instruction shall develop and
7 conduct an ongoing campaign for career and technical education to
8 increase awareness among teachers, counselors, students, parents,
9 principals, school administrators, and the general public about the
10 opportunities offered by rigorous career and technical education
11 programs, including existing and emerging opportunities in running
12 start programs. Messages in the campaign shall emphasize career and
13 technical education as a high quality educational pathway for
14 students, including for students who seek advanced education that
15 includes a bachelor's degree or beyond. In particular, the office
16 shall provide information about the following:

17 (a) The model career and technical education programs of study
18 developed under RCW 28A.700.060;

19 (b) Career and technical education course equivalencies and dual
20 credit for high school and college. Information provided in
21 accordance with this subsection (b) must include information about
22 courses that may be available to students, opportunities available
23 through running start programs, and options for incorporating
24 running start and career and technical education components into
25 high school and beyond plans required by RCW 28A.230.090;

26 (c) The availability of scholarships for postsecondary workforce
27 education, including the Washington award for vocational excellence,

1 and apprenticeships through the opportunity grant program under RCW
2 28B.50.271, grants under RCW 28A.700.090, and other programs; and

3 (d) Education, apprenticeship, and career opportunities in
4 emerging and highdemand programs.

5 (2) The office shall use multiple strategies in the campaign
6 depending on available funds, including developing an interactive
7 web site to encourage and facilitate career exploration; conducting
8 training and orientation for guidance counselors and teachers; and
9 developing and disseminating printed materials.

10 (3) The office shall seek advice, participation, and financial
11 assistance from the workforce training and education coordinating
12 board, higher education institutions, foundations, employers,
13 apprenticeship and training councils, workforce development
14 councils, and business and labor organizations for the campaign."

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16 Correct the title.

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EFFECT: (1) Modifies provisions of an awareness campaign for
career and technical education (CTE) that is conducted by the Office
of the Superintendent of Public instruction by requiring the
campaign to include information about existing and emerging
opportunities in running start programs.

(2) Requires course equivalency and dual credit information
provided through the campaign to include information about courses
that may be available to students, opportunities available through
running start programs, and options for incorporating running start
and CTE components into high school and beyond plans.

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
