5 In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon  
6 application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the  
7 holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special  
8 license plate fee as listed in this section.

3       (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the  
4 department:

5       (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized  
6 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license  
7 plates unless otherwise specified;

8       (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the  
9 department;

10       (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter  
11 46.87 RCW; and

12       (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

13       (2) The department approves and shall issue the following special  
14 license plates:

4-H	Displays the "4-H" logo.

Breast cancer awareness	Displays a pink ribbon symbolizing breast cancer awareness.

15 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters  
16 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility  
17 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington  
18 state council of firefighters.

19 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license  
20 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten  
21 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)  
22 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate  
23 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting  
24 service before ten years of service have been completed, the  
25 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the  
26 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer  
27 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,  
28 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter  
29 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will  
30 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying  
31 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates  
32 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their  
33 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a  
34 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be  
35 surrendered upon conviction.

36 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2019 c 384 s 3 and 2019 c 177 s 3 are  
37 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

1 (1) The department shall:

2 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW

3 46.17.220;

4 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial

5 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and

6 collection expenses incurred by it; and

7 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state

8 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

9 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor

10 vehicle (~~(account—[fund])~~) fund until the department determines that

11 the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the

12 special license plate. Upon determination by the department that the

13 state has been reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the

14 remaining special license plate fee amounts for each special license

15 plate to the following appropriate account as created in this section

Provide funds to Washington state mentors and the association of Washington generals created in RCW 43.15.030 in the following manner: (a) Seventy percent and the remaining proceeds, if any, to Washington state mentors, to increase the number of mentors in the state by offering mentoring grants throughout Washington state that foster positive youth development and academic success, with up to twenty percent of these proceeds authorized for program administration costs; and (b) up to thirty percent, not to exceed forty-thousand dollars annually as adjusted for inflation by the office of financial management, to the association of Washington generals, to develop Washington state educational, veterans, international relations, and civics projects and to recognize the outstanding public service of individuals or groups in the state of Washington

9 courts. Funds for construction  
10 must first be made available to the  
11 most populous eligible city,  
12 according to the most recent  
13 census, for a time period not to  
14 exceed five years after January 1,  
15 2017. After the five-year time  
16 period, the funds for construction  
17 must be made available to the  
18 next most populous eligible city.  
19 Funds for the maintenance of a  
20 public tennis facility with at least  
21 four indoor tennis courts must  
22 first be made available to the first  
23 eligible city that utilizes funds for  
24 construction provided by chapter  
25 16, Laws of 2016

11 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, only the  
12 director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from  
13 the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The  
14 accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW,  
15 but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.

16 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this section, funds in the  
17 special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this  
18 section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in  
19 subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the  
20 department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the  
21 services described in subsection (2) of this section.

22 (5) Funds from the Seattle Seahawks account may be provided to  
23 the lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the  
24 Washington world fellows program. Of the amounts received by the  
25 lieutenant governor's office under this subsection, at least ninety  
26 percent must be provided as fellowships under the program.

27 (6) Beginning January 1, 2019, funds from the Seattle Mariners  
28 account may be provided to the office of lieutenant governor solely  
29 for the purpose of administering the sports mentoring program. Of the  
30 amounts received by the office of lieutenant governor, at least  
31 ninety percent must be applied towards services directly provided to  
32 youth participants.

33 (7) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit  
34 organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in  
35 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status  
36 under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization  
37 must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

1        NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 4.**    A new section is added to chapter 46.04  
2    RCW to read as follows:

3        "Working forests license plates" means special license plates  
4    issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display images of a fish and a forest  
5    with text supporting working forests.

6        NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 5.**    This act takes effect October 1, 2021."

7        Correct the title.

EFFECT:    Updates the underlying bill by making technical  
corrections to reflect enacted legislation in the 2019 legislative  
session and changing the effective date to October 1, 2021.
