- 2 "Sec. 4. RCW 77.15.700 and 2012 c 176 s 35 are each amended to 3 read as follows:
- 4 (1) The department shall revoke a person's recreational license
- 5 or licenses and suspend a person's recreational license privileges
- 6 in the following circumstances:
- 7 (a) Upon conviction, if directed by statute for an offense.
- 8 (b) Upon conviction, failure to appear at a hearing to contest
- 9 an infraction or criminal charge, or an unvacated payment of a fine
- 10 or a finding of committed as a final disposition for any infraction,
- 11 if the department finds that actions of the defendant demonstrated a
- 12 willful or wanton disregard for conservation of fish or wildlife.
- 13 Suspension of privileges under this subsection ((may be)) is
- 14 permanent.
- (c) If a person is convicted, fails to appear at a hearing to
- 16 contest an infraction or criminal citation, or has an unvacated
- 17 payment of a fine or a finding of committed as a final disposition
- 18 for any infraction, twice within ten years for a violation involving
- 19 unlawful hunting, killing, or possessing big game. Revocation and
- 20 suspension under this subsection must be ordered for all hunting
- 21 privileges for at least two years and up to ten years.
- (d) If a person violates, three times or more in a ten-year
- 23 period, recreational hunting or fishing laws or rules for which the
- 24 person: (i) Is convicted of an offense; (ii) has an unvacated
- 25 payment of a fine or a finding of committed as a final disposition
- 26 for any infraction; or (iii) fails to appear at a hearing to contest
- 27 an infraction or a criminal citation. Revocation and suspension

- 1 under this subsection must be ordered of all recreational hunting
- 2 and fishing privileges for at least two years and up to ten years.
- 3 (2)(a) A violation punishable as an infraction counts towards
- 4 the revocation and suspension of recreational hunting and fishing
- 5 privileges under this section if that violation is:
- 6 (i) Punishable as a crime on July 24, 2005, and is subsequently
- 7 decriminalized; or
- 8 (ii) One of the following violations, as they exist on July 24,
- 9 2005: RCW 77.15.160; WAC 220-56-116; WAC 220-56-315(11); or WAC
- 10 220-56-355 (1) through (4).
- 11 (b) The commission may, by rule, designate infractions that do
- 12 not count towards the revocation and suspension of recreational
- 13 hunting and fishing privileges.
- 14 (3) If either the deferred education licensee or the required
- 15 nondeferred accompanying person, hunting under the authority of RCW
- 16 77.32.155(2), is convicted of a violation of this title, fails to
- 17 appear at a hearing to contest a fish and wildlife infraction or a
- 18 criminal citation, or has an unvacated payment of a fine or a
- 19 finding of committed as a final disposition for any fish and
- 20 wildlife infraction, except for a violation of RCW 77.15.400 (1)
- 21 through (4), the department may revoke all hunting licenses and tags
- 22 and may order a suspension of either or both the deferred education
- 23 licensee's and the nondeferred accompanying person's hunting
- 24 privileges for one year.
- 25 (4) A person who has a recreational license revoked and
- 26 privileges suspended under this section may file an appeal with the
- 27 department pursuant to chapter 34.05 RCW. An appeal must be filed
- 28 within twenty days of notice of license revocation and privilege
- 29 suspension. If an appeal is filed, the revocation and suspension
- 30 issued by the department do not take effect until twenty-one days
- 31 after the department has delivered an opinion. If no appeal is filed
- 32 within twenty days of notice of license revocation and suspension,
- 33 the right to an appeal is waived, and the revocation and suspension

- 1 take effect twenty-one days following the notice of revocation and 2 suspension.
- 3 (5) A recreational license revoked and privilege suspended under
- 4 this section is in addition to the statutory penalties assigned to
- 5 the underlying violation."

<u>EFFECT:</u> Modifies the requirements for revocation and suspension of recreational licenses issued by the Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) by making the following changes:

- •Requires permanent suspension of a person's recreational hunting and fishing privileges in certain circumstances, if the DFW finds that the person demonstrated a willful or wanton disregard for conservation of fish or wildlife.
- •Provides that a person's hunting and fishing privileges must be suspended for at least two years and may be suspended for up to ten years if the person is convicted of an infraction twice within ten years for violating rules involving big game or violates recreational hunting or fishing laws three or more times in a ten year period.
