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## <u>SSB 5370</u> - H AMD By Representative Orwall

## ADOPTED AND ENGROSSED 4/16/19

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 2 following:

Sec. 1. The legislature finds that with the 3 "NEW SECTION. increase in air traffic operations, combined with the projections for 4 the rapid expansion of these operations in both the short and the 5 long term, concerns regarding the environmental, health, social, and 6 7 economic impacts of air traffic are increasing as well. The legislature also finds that advancing Washington's position as a 8 national and international trading leader is dependent upon the 9 development of a highly competitive, statewide passenger and cargo 10 11 air transportation system. Therefore, the legislature 12 identify a location for a new primary commercial aviation facility in Washington, taking into consideration the data and conclusions of 13 14 appropriate air traffic studies, community representatives, and industry experts. Options for a new primary commercial aviation 15 facility in Washington may include expansion of an existing airport 16 17 facility. It is the intent of the legislature to establish a state 18 commercial aviation coordinating commission to provide a location recommendation by January 1, 2022. 19

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) The state commercial aviation coordinating commission is created to carry out the functions of this chapter. The commission shall consist of sixteen voting members.
- 23 (2) The governor shall appoint eleven voting members to represent 24 the following interests:
  - (a) Four as representatives of commercial service airports and ports, one of whom shall represent a port located in a county with a population of two million or more, one of whom shall represent a port in eastern Washington with an airport runway of at least thirteen thousand five hundred feet in length, one of whom shall represent a commercial service airport in eastern Washington located in a county

- 1 with a population of four hundred thousand or more, and one 2 representing an association of ports;
- 3 (b) Three as representatives from the airline industry and the 4 private sector;
- 5 (c) A representative from an eastern Washington metropolitan 6 planning organization;
  - (d) A representative from a western Washington metropolitan planning organization; and
- 9 (e) Two citizen representatives with one appointed from eastern 10 Washington and one appointed from western Washington. The citizen 11 appointees must:
- 12 (i) Represent the public interests in the communities that are included in the commission's site research; and
- 14 (ii) Understand the impacts of a large commercial aviation 15 facility on a community.
  - (3) The remaining five members shall consist of:

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- (a) A representative from the department of commerce;
- (b) A representative from the division of aeronautics of the department of transportation;
  - (c) A representative from the freight forwarding industry;
  - (d) A representative from the trucking industry; and
- 22 (e) A representative from the federal aviation administration's 23 flight standards district office in Washington.
  - (4) The commission shall invite the following nonvoting members:
  - (a) A representative from the federal aviation administration;
  - (b) A representative from the Washington state aviation alliance;
- 27 (c) A representative from the department of defense;
- (d) Two members from the senate, with one member from each of the two largest caucuses in the senate, appointed by the president of the senate;
- 31 (e) Two members from the house of representatives, with one 32 member from each of the two largest caucuses in the house of 33 representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house of 34 representatives;
  - (f) A representative from a statewide environmental organization;
- 36 (g) A representative from an organization concerned with land 37 and/or water use in the state;
- 38 (h) Congressional staff from the fourth and ninth congressional districts with expertise in aviation; and

- 1 (i) A representative from the division of aeronautics of the department of transportation.
  - (5) The governor may appoint additional nonvoting members as deemed appropriate. The commission shall allow additional nonvoting members at the request of the federal aviation administration.
  - (6) The commission shall select a chair from among its membership and shall adopt rules related to its powers and duties under this chapter.
  - (7) Legislative members of the commission are reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW 44.04.120. Nonlegislative members are not entitled to be reimbursed for travel expenses if they are elected officials or are participating on behalf of an employer, governmental entity, or other organization. Any reimbursement for other nonlegislative members is subject to chapter 43.03 RCW. The commission has all powers necessary to carry out its duties as prescribed by this chapter.
  - (8) The department of transportation shall provide staff support for coordinating and administering the commission and technical assistance as requested by commission members.
  - (9) At the direction of the commission, the department of transportation is authorized to hire a consultant to assist with the review and research efforts of the commission. The contract is exempt from the competitive procurement requirements in chapter 39.26 RCW.
- 24 (10) The governor or the governor's designee shall convene the 25 initial meeting of the commission as soon as practicable.
- 26 (11) This section expires July 1, 2022.

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Sec. 3. (1) The state commercial aviation 27 NEW SECTION. coordinating commission will review existing data and conduct 28 research to determine Washington's long-range commercial aviation 29 30 facility needs and the site of a new primary commercial aviation 31 facility. Research for each potential site must include the feasibility of constructing a commercial aviation facility in that 32 location and its potential environmental, community, and economic 33 impacts. Options for a new primary commercial aviation facility in 34 Washington may include expansion of an existing airport facility but 35 may not include siting a facility on or in the vicinity of a military 36 installation that would be incompatible with the installation's 37 38 ability to carry out its mission requirements. The work of the 39 commission shall include the following:

- 1 (a) Recommendations to the legislature on future Washington state 2 long-range commercial aviation facility needs including possible 3 additional aviation facilities or expansion of current aviation 4 facilities, excluding those located in a county with a population of 5 two million or more, to meet anticipated commercial aviation, general 6 aviation, and air cargo demands; and
  - (b) Identifying a preferred location for a new primary commercial aviation facility. The commission shall make recommendations and shall select a single preferred location by a sixty percent majority vote using the following process:
    - (i) Initiating a broad review of potential sites;
- 12 (ii) Recommending a final short list of no more than six locations by January 1, 2021;
- 14 (iii) Identifying the top two locations from the final six locations by September 1, 2021; and
- 16 (iv) Identifying a single preferred location for a new primary 17 commercial aviation facility by January 1, 2022.
- 18 (2) The commission shall submit a report of its findings and 19 recommendations to the transportation committees of the legislature 20 by January 1, 2022. The commission must allow a minority report to be 21 included with the commission report if requested by a voting member 22 of the commission.
- 23 (3) This section expires July 1, 2022.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. (1) The state commercial aviation coordinating commission shall project a timeline for the development of an additional commercial aviation facility that is completed and functional by 2040.
- 28 (2) This section expires July 1, 2022.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. (1) Nothing in this act shall be construed to endorse, limit, or otherwise alter existing or future plans for capital development and capacity enhancement at existing commercial airports in Washington.
- 33 (2) This section expires July 1, 2022."
