1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the
2 following:

3 **"Sec. 1.** RCW 18.25.190 and 2000 c 171 s 8 are each amended to
4 read as follows:

5 Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prohibit:

6 (1) The temporary practice in this state of chiropractic by any
7 chiropractor licensed by another state, territory, or country in
8 which he or she resides. However, the chiropractor shall not
9 establish a practice open to the general public and shall not engage
10 in temporary practice under this section for a period longer than
11 thirty days. The chiropractor shall register his or her intention to
12 engage in the temporary practice of chiropractic in this state with
13 the commission before engaging in the practice of chiropractic, and
14 shall agree to be bound by such conditions as may be prescribed by
15 rule by the commission.

16 (2) The practice of chiropractic(~~(, except the administration of~~
17 ~~a chiropractic adjustment,)~~) by a person who is a regular senior
18 student in an accredited school of chiropractic approved by the
19 commission if the practice is part of a regular course of instruction
20 offered by the school and the student is under the direct supervision
21 and control of a chiropractor duly licensed pursuant to this chapter
22 and approved by the commission. A senior student practicing
23 chiropractic under this subsection must pass an open book written
24 jurisprudence examination approved by the commission prior to
25 administering a chiropractic adjustment. The commission may adopt
26 rules requiring the student and his or her supervising licensed
27 chiropractor to file information with the commission regarding the
28 practice of chiropractic under this subsection, including the name
29 and contact information of the student, the name and contact
30 information of the supervising licensed chiropractor, and the
31 location where the student will be practicing.

1 (3) The practice of chiropractic by a person serving a period of
2 postgraduate chiropractic training in a program of clinical
3 chiropractic training sponsored by a school of chiropractic
4 accredited in this state if the practice is part of his or her duties
5 as a clinical postgraduate trainee and the trainee is under the
6 direct supervision and control of a chiropractor duly licensed
7 pursuant to this chapter and approved by the commission.

8 (4) The practice of chiropractic by a person who is eligible and
9 has applied to take the next available examination for licensing
10 offered by the commission, except that the unlicensed chiropractor
11 must provide all services under the direct control and supervision of
12 a licensed chiropractor approved by the commission. The unlicensed
13 chiropractor may continue to practice as provided by this subsection
14 until the results of the next available examination are published,
15 but in no case for a period longer than six months. The commission
16 shall adopt rules necessary to effectuate the intent of this
17 subsection.

18 Any provision of chiropractic services by any individual under
19 subsection (1), (2), (3), or (4) of this section shall be subject to
20 the jurisdiction of the commission as provided in chapter 18.130
21 RCW."

22 Correct the title.

EFFECT: Allows the Chiropractic Quality Assurance Commission (CQAC) to adopt rules requiring a senior chiropractic student practicing chiropractic without a license and his or her supervising chiropractor to file information with the CQAC, including the name and contact information of the student, the name and contact information of the supervising chiropractor, and the location where the student will be practicing.
