13 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following
14 conditions and limitations:

15 (1) \$7,111,000 of the general fund—state appropriation for fiscal year
16 2020 and \$7,111,000 of the general fund—state appropriation for fiscal
17 year 2021 are provided solely for state matching money for federal
18 child nutrition programs, and may support the meals for kids program
19 through the following allowable uses:

20 (a) Elimination of breakfast copays for eligible public school
21 students and lunch copays for eligible public school students in
22 grades kindergarten through third grade who are eligible for
23 reduced-price lunch;

24 (b) Assistance to school districts and authorized public and private
25 nonprofit organizations for supporting summer food service programs,
26 and initiating new summer food service programs in low-income areas;

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1 (c) Reimbursements to school districts for school breakfasts served to
2 students eligible for free and reduced-price lunch, pursuant to
3 chapter 287, Laws of 2005; and

4 (d) Assistance to school districts in initiating and expanding school
5 breakfast programs.

6 (2) The office of the superintendent of public instruction shall
7 report annually to the fiscal committees of the legislature on annual
8 expenditures in subsection (1)(a) through (c) of this section.

9 (3) The superintendent of public instruction shall provide the
10 department of health with the following data, where available, for all
11 nutrition assistance programs that are funded by the United States
12 department of agriculture and administered by the office of the
13 superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent must provide
14 the report for the preceding federal fiscal year by February 1, 2020,
15 and February 1, 2021. The report must provide:

16 (a) The number of people in Washington who are eligible for the
17 program;

18 (b) The number of people in Washington who participated in the
19 program;

20 (c) The average annual participation rate in the program;

21 (d) Participation rates by geographic distribution; and

22 (e) The annual federal funding of the program in Washington.

23 (4) \$119,000 of the general fund-state appropriation for fiscal year
24 2020 and \$119,000 of the general fund-state appropriation for fiscal
25 year 2021 are provided solely for implementation of chapter 271, Laws
26 of 2018 (school meal payment) to increase the number of schools
27 participating in the federal community eligibility program and to
28 support breakfast after the bell programs authorized by the
29 legislature that have adopted the community eligibility provision.

30 (5) \$5,000,000 of the general fund-state appropriation for fiscal
31 year 2021 is provided solely for the elimination of lunch copays for
32 eligible public school students in grades four through twelve who are
33 eligible for reduced-price lunch."

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EFFECT: Reduces The Evergreen State College's general fund-state appropriation per full-time equivalent student to be closer to the regional universities. Provides funding to OSPI to eliminate lunch copays for students in grades four through twelve who are eligible for reduced-price lunch. Increases funding to OSPI for grants to school districts to reduce the cost of associated student body fees or participation fees for students who are eligible to participate in the federal Free or Reduced Price School Meals program.

FISCAL IMPACT: No net change to appropriated levels.

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
