4 (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the
5 department:

6 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized
7 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license
8 plates unless otherwise specified;

9 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the
10 department;

11 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter
12 46.87 RCW; and

13 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

14 (2) The department approves and shall issue the following special
15 license plates, subject to subsection (5) of this section:

15 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
16 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
17 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
18 state council of firefighters.

19 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license
20 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten
21 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)
22 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate
23 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting
24 service before ten years of service have been completed, the
25 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the
26 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer
27 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,
28 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter
29 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will
30 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying
31 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates
32 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their
33 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a
34 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be
35 surrendered upon conviction.

36 (5) The department shall not issue the working forests special
37 license plate until the department receives signature sheets
38 satisfying the requirements identified in RCW 46.18.110(2)(f).

2 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

3 (1) The department shall:

4 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW
5 46.17.220;

6 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial
7 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and
8 collection expenses incurred by it; and

9 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state
10 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

11 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor
12 vehicle (~~(account—[fund])~~) fund until the department determines that
13 the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the
14 special license plate. Upon determination by the department that the
15 state has been reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the
16 remaining special license plate fee amounts for each special license
17 plate to the following appropriate account as created in this section
18 in the custody of the state treasurer:

(3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, only the director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.

(4) Except as otherwise provided in this section, funds in the special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this section.

(5) Funds from the Seattle Seahawks account may be provided to the lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the Washington world fellows program. Of the amounts received by the lieutenant governor's office under this subsection, at least ninety percent must be provided as fellowships under the program.

(6) Beginning January 1, 2019, funds from the Seattle Mariners account may be provided to the office of lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the sports mentoring program. Of the amounts received by the office of lieutenant governor, at least ninety percent must be applied towards services directly provided to youth participants.

(7) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04
2 RCW to read as follows:

3 "Working forests license plates" means special license plates
4 issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display images of a fish and a forest
5 with text supporting working forests.

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** This act takes effect October 1, 2021."

7 On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "forests;" strike the
8 remainder of the title and insert "reenacting and amending RCW
9 46.17.220, 46.18.200, and 46.68.420; adding a new section to chapter
10 46.04 RCW; and providing an effective date."

EFFECT: Prohibits DOL from issuing the working forests special
license plate until DOL receives signature sheets reflecting the
required minimum number of intended purchases of the plate.
