HB 1082

Brief Description: Concerning the licensure and certification of massage therapists and reflexologists.

Sponsors: Representatives Kraft, Wylie, Harris, Cody, Vick and Hoff.

Brief Summary of Bill

• Requires massage therapists and reflexologists to have government-issued photo identification on their person when providing services beginning January 1, 2020.

Background:

Massage Therapy Licenses.

Massage therapy is a health care service involving the external manipulation or pressure of soft tissue for therapeutic purposes. Massage therapists are required to become licensed. The Secretary of Health (Secretary) issues the license to applicants who are at least age 18 or older and provide proof of:

- successful completion of a course of study in an approved massage program, transfer program, or approved apprenticeship program; and
- successful completion of an examination administered or approved by the Washington State Board of Massage.

Reflexology Certifications.

Reflexology is a health care service in which a practitioner applies alternate pressure with thumb and finger techniques to reflexive areas of the lower one-third of extremities, feet, hands, and outer ears based on reflex maps. Reflexologists are required to be certified. Certificates are issued by the Secretary to applicants who are at least age 18 or older and provide proof of:

• successful completion of a reflexologist course of study approved by the Secretary; and

• successful completion of an examination administered or approved by the Secretary.

Display of Licenses and Certifications.

Both massage therapists and reflexologists must have their respective licenses or certificates on display at their places of business or wherever they practice.

Summary of Bill:

Beginning January 1, 2020, massage therapists and reflexologists must have a government-issued photo identification on his or her person at all times when practicing massage therapy or reflexology. The photo identification must have the same name as the massage therapy license or reflexology certification.
