Summary of Bill: he Washington Rural Development and Distressed Opportunity Zone Act is established for the stated purpose of creating and retaining jobs in rural and distressed opportunity zone areas of Washington.

- "Credit-eligible capital contribution" means an investment of cash by a person subject
 to either insurance premium taxes or business and occupation (B&O) taxes in a Fund
 that equals the amount specified on a tax credit certificate issued by the Department
 of Commerce (Commerce).
