Summary of Bill:

The requirement that conservation district-sponsored fish habitat enhancement projects eligible for streamlined review follow design standards established by the Conservation Commission through an interagency agreement with the United States Fish and Wildlife Service and the Natural Resource Conservation Service is removed.

Conservation district-sponsored fish habitat enhancement projects determined to be eligible for streamlined review must be approved by conservation districts. Conservation districts sponsored projects must provide copies of the completed application form to DFW and the Conservation Commission.
