## HOUSE BILL 1507

State of Washington 66th Legislature 2019 Regular Session

By Representatives Walsh and Kraft

Read first time 01/23/19. Referred to Committee on Capital Budget.

- AN ACT Relating to promoting physical safety and security of school buildings, grounds, and surroundings through environmental design principles; amending RCW 28A.335.010 and 28A.525.172; creating a new section; and repealing RCW 28A.525.050.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that recent acts of 7 mass violence across the nation have threatened the safety of children at school. Thus, the legislature intends to implement short 8 and long-term strategies that empower school districts to protect our 9 10 students and provide a safe and secure learning environment. The 11 legislature further intends to adopt policies that support our 12 schools and enable them to increase security, provide protections for students and staff, and develop local strategies to 13 identify and intervene against potential threats. The legislature 14 15 finds that safety-focused design elements in the built environment 16 can reduce and deter criminal activity and increase safety. 17 Therefore, it is the intent of the legislature to encourage the 18 incorporation of these design elements into the construction of 19 school facilities as a long-term strategy to reduce incidences of violence and increase the safety of students and staff. 20

- (1) Every board of directors, unless otherwise specifically provided by law, shall:
  - (a) Cause all school buildings to be properly heated, lighted, and ventilated and maintained in a clean and sanitary condition; and
- 7 (b) Maintain and repair, furnish, and insure such school 8 buildings.
- 9 (2) Every board of directors, unless otherwise specifically 10 provided by law, shall also:
  - (a) Consider installing a perimeter security control mechanism or system on all school campuses, as appropriate to the design of the campus; and
    - (b) For new school construction projects or remodeling projects of more than forty percent of an existing school building that are initiated after July ((28, 2013)) 1, 2020, consider school building plans and designs that promote:
  - (i) An optimal level of security for the specific school site that incorporates evolving technology and best practices to protect students and staff in the event of a threat during school hours;
- 21 (ii) Direct control and observation of the public entering school grounds; ((and))
- (iii) The public entering school grounds through as few entrances as possible, such as through the main entrance of a school's administrative offices; and
  - (iv) Effective physical safety and security through natural surveillances, natural access controls, and territorial reinforcements, or other safety-focused environmental design elements, while maintaining functional and aesthetic qualities of school buildings, grounds, and surroundings.
- 31 (3) The purpose of subsection (2) of this section is to promote 32 generally the safety of all students and staff in Washington public 33 schools. Nothing in subsection (2) of this section creates any civil 34 liability for school districts, or creates a new cause of action or 35 new theory of negligence against a school district board of 36 directors, a school district, or the state.

- (1) All applications by school districts for state assistance in providing school plant facilities shall be made to the superintendent of public instruction in conformity with rules adopted by the superintendent of public instruction, considering policy recommendations from the school facilities citizen advisory panel.
- 6 (2) Studies and surveys shall be conducted by the superintendent 7 for the purpose of securing information relating to:
- 8 (a)  $((\frac{1}{1}))$  The kind and extent of the school plant facilities 9 required and the urgency of need for such facilities in districts 10 that seek state assistance  $(\frac{1}{1})$ ;
- 11 (b)  $((\frac{\{(2)\}}{}))$  The ability of such districts to provide capital funds by local effort $((\tau))$ ;
- 13 (c)  $((\frac{\{(3)\}}{)})$  The need for improvement of school administrative units and school attendance areas among or within such districts  $((\tau_{and}))$ ;
- 16 (d) ((<del>[(4)]</del>)) <u>An assessment of the safety and security of school</u>
  17 buildings, grounds, and surroundings through:
- 18 <u>(i) Natural surveillances that maximize natural visibility and</u>
  19 observation to deter criminal activity;
- 20 <u>(ii) Natural access controls that deny access to a crime target</u>
  21 <u>and reduce escape opportunities; and</u>
- 22 <u>(iii) Territorial reinforcements that create and extend a sphere</u> 23 of influence over school property; and
- 24 <u>(e) Any other pertinent matters.</u>
