1 AN ACT Relating to sunshine committee recommendations; amending
2 RCW 42.56.230 and 42.56.250; reenacting and amending RCW 42.56.270;
3 adding a new section to chapter 42.56 RCW; and repealing RCW
4 39.26.030.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 42.56.230 and 2018 c 109 s 16 are each amended to
7 read as follows:

8 The following personal information is exempt from public
9 inspection and copying under this chapter, unless the agency has
10 received consent for disclosure from the subject of the information
11 or, in the case of a child, from the child's parent or guardian:

12 (1) Personal information in any files maintained for students in
13 public schools, patients or clients of public institutions or public
14 health agencies, or welfare recipients;

15 (2)(a) Personal information:

16 (i) For a child enrolled in licensed child care in any files
17 maintained by the department of children, youth, and families;

18 (ii) For a child enrolled in a public or nonprofit program
19 serving or pertaining to children, adolescents, or students,
20 including but not limited to early learning or child care services,

1 parks and recreation programs, youth development programs, and after-
2 school programs; or

3 (iii) For the family members or guardians of a child who is
4 subject to the exemption under this subsection (2) if the family
5 member or guardian has the same last name as the child or if the
6 family member or guardian resides at the same address as the child
7 and disclosure of the family member's or guardian's information would
8 result in disclosure of the personal information exempted under
9 (a)(i) and (ii) of this subsection.

10 (b) Emergency contact information under this subsection (2) may
11 be provided to appropriate authorities and medical personnel for the
12 purpose of treating the individual during an emergency situation;

13 (3) Personal information in files maintained for employees,
14 appointees, or elected officials of any public agency to the extent
15 that disclosure would violate their right to privacy;

16 (4) Information required of any taxpayer in connection with the
17 assessment or collection of any tax if the disclosure of the
18 information to other persons would: (a) Be prohibited to such persons
19 by RCW 84.08.210, 82.32.330, 84.40.020, 84.40.340, or any ordinance
20 authorized under RCW 35.102.145; or (b) violate the taxpayer's right
21 to privacy or result in unfair competitive disadvantage to the
22 taxpayer;

23 (5) Credit card numbers, debit card numbers, electronic check
24 numbers, card expiration dates, or bank or other financial
25 information as defined in RCW 9.35.005 including social security
26 numbers, except when disclosure is expressly required by or governed
27 by other law;

28 (6) Personal and financial information related to a small loan or
29 any system of authorizing a small loan in RCW 31.45.093;

30 (7)(a) Any record used to prove identity, age, residential
31 address, social security number, or other personal information
32 required to apply for a driver's license or identicard.

33 (b) Information provided under RCW 46.20.111 that indicates that
34 an applicant declined to register with the selective service system.

35 (c) Any record pertaining to a vehicle license plate, driver's
36 license, or identicard issued under RCW 46.08.066 that, alone or in
37 combination with any other records, may reveal the identity of an
38 individual, or reveal that an individual is or was, performing an
39 undercover or covert law enforcement, confidential public health
40 work, public assistance fraud, or child support investigative

1 activity. This exemption does not prevent the release of the total
2 number of vehicle license plates, drivers' licenses, or identicards
3 that, under RCW 46.08.066, an agency or department has applied for,
4 been issued, denied, returned, destroyed, lost, and reported for
5 misuse.

6 (d) Any record pertaining to a vessel registration issued under
7 RCW 88.02.330 that, alone or in combination with any other records,
8 may reveal the identity of an individual, or reveal that an
9 individual is or was, performing an undercover or covert law
10 enforcement activity. This exemption does not prevent the release of
11 the total number of vessel registrations that, under RCW 88.02.330,
12 an agency or department has applied for, been issued, denied,
13 returned, destroyed, lost, and reported for misuse;

14 (8) All information related to individual claims resolution
15 structured settlement agreements submitted to the board of industrial
16 insurance appeals under RCW 51.04.063, other than final orders from
17 the board of industrial insurance appeals.

18 Upon request by the legislature, the department of licensing
19 shall provide a report to the legislature containing all of the
20 information in subsection (7)(c) and (d) of this section that is
21 subject to public disclosure;

22 (9) Voluntarily submitted information contained in a database
23 that is part of or associated with enhanced 911 emergency
24 communications systems, or information contained or used in emergency
25 notification systems as provided under RCW 38.52.575 and 38.52.577;
26 and

27 (10) Until the person reaches eighteen years of age, information,
28 otherwise disclosable under chapter 29A.08 RCW, that relates to a
29 future voter, except for the purpose of processing and delivering
30 ballots.

31 **Sec. 2.** RCW 42.56.250 and 2018 c 109 s 17 are each amended to
32 read as follows:

33 The following employment and licensing information is exempt from
34 public inspection and copying under this chapter:

35 (1) Test questions, scoring keys, and other examination data used
36 to administer a license, employment, or academic examination;

37 (2) All applications for public employment, including the names
38 of applicants, resumes, and other related materials submitted with
39 respect to an applicant;

1 (3) Professional growth plans (PGPs) in educator license renewals
2 submitted through the eCert system in the office of the
3 superintendent of public instruction;

4 (4)(a) The following information held by any public agency in
5 personnel records, public employment related records, volunteer
6 rosters, or included in any mailing list of employees or volunteers
7 of any public agency:

8 (i) Residential addresses (not including city, state, and zip
9 codes), residential telephone numbers, personal wireless telephone
10 numbers, personal email addresses, social security numbers, driver's
11 license numbers, identicard numbers, passport and visa numbers, and
12 emergency contact information of employees or volunteers of a public
13 agency(~~(7)~~); and (~~the names, dates of birth, residential addresses,~~
14 ~~residential telephone numbers, personal wireless telephone numbers,~~
15 ~~personal email addresses, social security numbers, and emergency~~
16 ~~contact information)~~)

17 (ii) All identifying and contact information of dependents of
18 employees or volunteers of a public agency.

19 (b) For purposes of this subsection (4), "employees" includes
20 independent provider home care workers as defined in RCW 74.39A.240;

21 (5) Information that identifies a person who, while an agency
22 employee: (a) Seeks advice, under an informal process established by
23 the employing agency, in order to ascertain his or her rights in
24 connection with a possible unfair practice under chapter 49.60 RCW
25 against the person; and (b) requests his or her identity or any
26 identifying information not be disclosed;

27 (6) Investigative records compiled by an employing agency
28 conducting an active and ongoing investigation of a possible unfair
29 practice under chapter 49.60 RCW or of a possible violation of other
30 federal, state, or local laws prohibiting discrimination in
31 employment. For purposes of this subsection, the exemption is
32 categorical and exempts the records in their entirety while the
33 investigation is ongoing. Once the agency has notified the
34 complaining employee of the outcome of the investigation, the
35 exemption no longer applies;

36 (7) Criminal history records checks for board staff finalist
37 candidates conducted pursuant to RCW 43.33A.025;

38 (8) Except as provided in RCW 47.64.220, salary and benefit
39 information for maritime employees collected from private employers
40 under RCW 47.64.220(1) and described in RCW 47.64.220(2);

1 (9) Photographs and month and year of birth in the personnel
2 files of employees and workers of criminal justice agencies as
3 defined in RCW 10.97.030. The news media, as defined in RCW
4 5.68.010(5), shall have access to the photographs and full date of
5 birth. For the purposes of this subsection, news media does not
6 include any person or organization of persons in the custody of a
7 criminal justice agency as defined in RCW 10.97.030;

8 (10) The global positioning system data that would indicate the
9 location of the residence of a public employee or volunteer using the
10 global positioning system recording device; and

11 (11) Until the person reaches eighteen years of age, information,
12 otherwise disclosable under chapter 29A.08 RCW, that relates to a
13 future voter, except for the purpose of processing and delivering
14 ballots.

15 **Sec. 3.** RCW 42.56.270 and 2018 c 201 s 8008, 2018 c 196 s 21,
16 and 2018 c 4 s 9 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

17 (1) The following financial, commercial, and proprietary
18 information is exempt from disclosure under this chapter, as long as
19 the information is clearly marked as confidential and accompanied by
20 a particularized explanation of expected harm from disclosure at the
21 time of submission, subject to subsection (2) of this section:

23 code or object code, and research data obtained by any agency within
24 five years of the request for disclosure when disclosure would
25 produce private gain and public loss;

28 a bid or proposal for ~~((a))~~ (i) a ferry system construction or
29 repair contract as required by RCW 47.60.680 through 47.60.750 or

32 ~~((3))~~ (c) Financial and commercial information and records
33 supplied by private persons pertaining to export services provided
34 under chapters 43.163 and 53.31 RCW, and by persons pertaining to
35 export projects under RCW 43.23.035;

36 ~~((4))~~ (d) Financial and commercial information and records
37 supplied by businesses or individuals during application for loans or
38 program services provided by chapters 43.325, 43.163, 43.160, 43.330,

1 and 43.168 RCW, or during application for economic development loans
2 or program services provided by any local agency;

3 ~~((5))~~ (e) Financial information, business plans, examination
4 reports, and any information produced or obtained in evaluating or
5 examining a business and industrial development corporation organized

28 liquor license, gambling license, or lottery retail license;

26 siting, recruitment, expansion, retention, or relocation of that
27 person's business, information described in ~~((a)(ii))~~ (l)(i)(B) of
28 this subsection will be available to the public under this chapter;

30 or obtained by the department of ecology or the authority created

11 under the federal clean water act, 33 U.S.C. Sec. 1251 et seq., are
12 subject to RCW 42.56.610 and 90.64.190;

14 research information and data submitted to or obtained by a health
15 sciences and services authority in applications for, or delivery of,
16 grants under RCW 35.104.010 through 35.104.060, to the extent that

18 in private loss to providers of this information;

22 obtained by the University of Washington, other than information the

24 information relates to investments in private funds, to the extent
25 that such information, if revealed, would reasonably be expected to
26 result in loss to the University of Washington consolidated endowment
27 fund or to result in private loss to the providers of this
28 information;

36 on behalf of an investor for the purpose of purchasing such

12 (2) (a) If an agency receives a request for information under
13 subsection (1) of this section that is not clearly marked as
14 confidential and accompanied by a particularized explanation of
15 expected harm from disclosure, the agency must notify the subject of
16 the information of the request within five business days of receiving
17 the request.

18 (b) The time that an agency has to respond to a request for
19 information under RCW 42.56.520 is suspended until twenty business
20 days after the agency sends notice to the subject of the information.
21 The agency shall notify the requester of the need to notify third
22 parties affected by the request.

23 (c) If the subject of the information provides the agency with a
24 written statement of the need to keep the information confidential,
25 including a particularized explanation of expected harm from
26 disclosure, within fifteen business days after the agency sends
27 notice to the subject of the information, the information is exempt
28 from disclosure. If the agency does not receive such a statement from
29 the subject of the information, the information must be disclosed.

30 (d) If the requester initiates an action to compel disclosure
31 under this chapter, the subject of the information must be joined as
32 a party to demonstrate the need for confidentiality.

33 (3) In any action under RCW 42.56.540 to enjoin disclosure of
34 financial, commercial, or proprietary information pursuant to this
35 section, the court may award attorneys' fees to any defendant,
36 including a requester or agency, to the extent that the defendant
37 prevailed in opposing an injunction.

38 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 42.56
39 RCW to read as follows:

1 Bids, quotations, or proposals submitted to an agency for goods
2 or services in response to a solicitation issued for such goods or
3 services are exempt from disclosure until the agency announces the
4 apparent successful bidder based on predetermined criteria or decides
5 not to accept any bids, quotations, or proposals.

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** RCW 39.26.030 (State procurement records—
7 Disclosure) and 2012 c 224 s 4 are each repealed.

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
