- AN ACT Relating to the procurement and use of facial recognition technology by government entities in Washington state and privacy rights relating to facial recognition technology; and creating new sections.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the current 7 facial state of recognition technology is less accurate identifying women, youth, and people of color, potentially leading to 8 the risk of false matches. Accordingly, the legislature finds that 9 10 results from a facial recognition system should not, by themselves, 11 constitute probable cause in a criminal investigation.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) A law enforcement officer may not use the results of a facial recognition system as the sole basis to establish probable cause in a criminal investigation. The results of a facial recognition system may be used in conjunction with other information and evidence obtained by a law enforcement officer to establish probable cause in a criminal investigation.
- 18 (2) For purposes of this section:
- 19 (a) "Facial recognition" means both:

(i) The automated or semiautomated process by which a person is identified or attempted to be identified based on the characteristics of their face, including identification of known or unknown individuals or groups; and

- 5 (ii) The automated or semiautomated process by which the 6 characteristics of an individual's face are analyzed to determine the 7 individual's sentiment, state of mind, or other propensities 8 including but not limited to level of dangerousness.
- 9 (b) "Facial recognition system" means any computer software or application that performs facial recognition.
- 11 (c) "Law enforcement officer" means a general authority 12 Washington peace officer, a limited authority Washington peace 13 officer, and a specially commissioned Washington peace officer as 14 defined in RCW 10.93.020.
