- AN ACT Relating to requiring additional information in

- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 29A.60.235 and 2018 c 218 s 9 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1) The county auditor shall prepare at the time of certification 7 an election reconciliation report that discloses the following 8 information:
  - (a) The number of registered voters;
- 10 (b) The <u>total</u> number of ballots issued, <u>received</u>, <u>counted</u>, <u>and</u>
  11 <u>rejected</u>;
- 12 (c) The number of ballots, categorized by precinct, that are 13 <u>issued</u>, received, counted, and rejected;

- 15 (e) The number of ballots rejected;

- 5 <u>(ii) The signature on the declaration did not match the signature</u> 6 <u>on file;</u>
- 7 (iii) The ballot was postmarked after the deadline pursuant to 8 RCW 29A.40.110;
- 9 <u>(iv) The voter has already received credit for voting in the same</u> 10 <u>general election, special election, or primary;</u>
- 11 (v) Of failure to send an original or hard copy of the ballot, if 12 initially sent by email or facsimile, by the certification deadline; 13 or
  - (vi) Of any other reason, including the reason for rejection; and
  - (ee) Any other information the auditor or secretary of state deems necessary to reconcile the number of ballots counted with the number of voters credited with voting, and to maintain an audit trail.
  - (2) The county auditor shall reconcile the information in subsection (1)(b) of this section with the information in subsection (1)(c) of this section. Any discrepancies must be documented in the reconciliation report, including the reason for the discrepancy.
  - (3) The county auditor must make the report available to the public at the auditor's office and must publish the report on the auditor's web site at the time of certification. The county auditor must submit the report to the secretary of state at the time of certification in any form determined by the secretary of state.
  - $((\frac{(3)}{(3)}))$   $\underline{(4)}$  (a) The secretary of state must collect the reconciliation reports from each county auditor and prepare a statewide reconciliation report for each state primary and general election. The report may be produced in a form determined by the secretary that includes the information as described in this subsection  $((\frac{(3)}{(3)}))$   $\underline{(4)}$ . The report must be prepared and published on the secretary of state's web site within two months after the last county's election results have been certified.
  - (b) The state report must include a comparison among counties on rates of votes received, counted, and rejected, including provisional, write-in, overseas ballots, and ballots transmitted electronically. The comparison information may be in the form of

rankings, percentages, or other relevant quantifiable data that can be used to measure performance and trends.

(c) The state report must also include an analysis of the data that can be used to develop a better understanding of election administration and policy. The analysis must combine data, as available, over multiple years to provide broader comparisons and trends regarding voter registration and turnout and ballot counting. The analysis must incorporate national election statistics to the extent such information is available.
