1 AN ACT Relating to creating Washington wine special license
2 plates; amending RCW 46.68.420; reenacting and amending RCW
3 46.17.220, 46.18.200, and 46.68.420; adding a new section to chapter
4 46.04 RCW; and providing an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 46.17.220 and 2019 c 384 s 2 and 2019 c 177 s 2 are
7 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

8 In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon
9 application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the
10 holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special
11 license plate fee as listed in this section.

16 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

17 (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the
18 department:

19 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized
20 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license
21 plates unless otherwise specified;

22 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the
23 department;

24 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter
25 46.87 RCW; and

26 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

27 (2) The department approves and shall issue the following special
28 license plates:

31 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
32 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
33 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
34 state council of firefighters.

35 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license
36 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten
37 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)
38 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate

1 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting
2 service before ten years of service have been completed, the
3 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the
4 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer
5 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,
6 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter
7 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will
8 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying
9 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates
10 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their
11 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a
12 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be
13 surrendered upon conviction.

14 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2019 c 384 s 3 and 2019 c 177 s 3 are
15 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

16 (1) The department shall:

17 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW
18 46.17.220;

19 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial
20 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and
21 collection expenses incurred by it; and

22 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state
23 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

24 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor
25 vehicle (~~(account—[fund])~~) fund until the department determines that
26 the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the
27 special license plate. Upon determination by the department that the
28 state has been reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the
29 remaining special license plate fee amounts for each special license
30 plate to the following appropriate account as created in this section
31 in the custody of the state treasurer:

Seattle Sounders FC

Provide funds to Washington state mentors and the association of Washington generals created in RCW 43.15.030 in the following manner: (a) Seventy percent and the remaining proceeds, if any, to Washington state mentors, to increase the number of mentors in the state by offering mentoring grants throughout Washington state that foster positive youth development and academic success, with up to twenty percent of these proceeds authorized for program administration costs; and (b) up to thirty percent, not to exceed forty-thousand dollars annually as adjusted for inflation by the office of financial management, to the association of Washington generals, to develop Washington state educational, veterans, international relations, and civics projects and to recognize the outstanding public service of individuals or groups in the state of Washington

Washington tennis

Provide funds to cities to assist in the construction and maintenance of a public tennis facility with at least four indoor tennis courts. A city is eligible for construction funds if the city does not already have a public or private facility with at least four indoor tennis courts. Funds for construction must first be made available to the most populous eligible city, according to the most recent census, for a time period not to exceed five years after January 1, 2017. After the five-year time period, the funds for construction must be made available to the next most populous eligible city. Funds for the maintenance of a public tennis facility with at least four indoor tennis courts must first be made available to the first eligible city that utilizes funds for construction provided by chapter 16, Laws of 2016

Washington wine

Provide funds to the Washington wine commission, established in RCW 15.88.030, to support research and collaboration with the wine science facility at Washington State University's Tri-Cities campus

1 Washington's national park fund Build awareness of Washington's
2 national parks and support priority
3 park programs and projects in
4 Washington's national parks, such
5 as enhancing visitor experience,
6 promoting volunteerism, engaging
7 communities, and providing
8 educational opportunities related
9 to Washington's national parks

10 We love our pets Support and enable the
11 Washington federation of animal
12 welfare and control agencies to
13 promote and perform spay/neuter
14 surgery of Washington state pets
15 in order to reduce pet population

16 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, only the
17 director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from
18 the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The
19 accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW,
20 but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.

21 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this section, funds in the
22 special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this
23 section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in
24 subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the
25 department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the
26 services described in subsection (2) of this section.

27 (5) Funds from the Seattle Seahawks account may be provided to
28 the lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the
29 Washington world fellows program. Of the amounts received by the
30 lieutenant governor's office under this subsection, at least ninety
31 percent must be provided as fellowships under the program.

32 (6) Beginning January 1, 2019, funds from the Seattle Mariners
33 account may be provided to the office of lieutenant governor solely
34 for the purpose of administering the sports mentoring program. Of the
35 amounts received by the office of lieutenant governor, at least
36 ninety percent must be applied towards services directly provided to
37 youth participants.

38 (7) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit
39 organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in

1 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status
2 under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization
3 must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04
5 RCW to read as follows:

6 "Washington wine license plates" means special license plates
7 issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display a landscape of Washington's
8 wine regions.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** This act takes effect October 1, 2020.
