1 AN ACT Relating to auditing the marijuana traceability system;
2 adding a new section to chapter 69.50 RCW; and providing an
3 expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 69.50
6 RCW to read as follows:

7 (1) The state auditor, in consultation with the liquor and
8 cannabis board, shall audit and produce a report on the marijuana
9 traceability system. The report required under this subsection must
10 include the following information, broken down into monthly periods
11 beginning for April 2017 and continuing until the date the report is
12 prepared:

13 (a) The amount of useable marijuana produced by licensed
14 marijuana producers;

15 (b) The amount of useable marijuana sold by licensed marijuana
16 retailers;

17 (c) The amount of marijuana concentrates processed or
18 manufactured by licensed marijuana processors, and the amount of
19 marijuana concentrates sold by licensed marijuana retailers;

20 (d) The number of plants, immature plants, or clones that are
21 planted or started by licensed marijuana producers;

- 1 (e) The number of plants harvested by licensed marijuana
2 producers;
- 3 (f) The number of plants, immature plants, and clones lost or
4 otherwise unaccounted for in the marijuana traceability system;
- 5 (g) The amount of marijuana products lost or otherwise
6 unaccounted for in the marijuana traceability system;
- 7 (h) Sales of marijuana products that are determined to be
8 medically compliant by the department of health under chapter 69.51A
9 RCW, in terms of units sold and the dollar value of such marijuana
10 products sold per month; and
- 11 (i) The average retail dollar value per gram of useable marijuana
12 sold by marijuana retailers.
- 13 (2) In addition to the report described in subsection (1) of this
14 section, the state auditor and the liquor and cannabis board must
15 prepare a report describing the capabilities and functions of the
16 marijuana traceability system. The report required under this
17 subsection must:
- 18 (a) Compare the capabilities and functions of the marijuana
19 traceability system as provided in the contract between the state and
20 the vendor, relative to the capabilities and functions of the
21 marijuana traceability system in practice; and
- 22 (b) Detail any deficiencies or additional capabilities or
23 functions of the marijuana traceability system provided or operated
24 by the vendor, as compared to the capabilities and functions of the
25 marijuana traceability system described in the state and vendor's
26 contract.
- 27 (3) The two reports required under this section must be submitted
28 to the appropriate committees of the legislature by January 10, 2020.
- 29 (4) For purposes of this section the term "marijuana traceability
30 system" means the software program, product, and services provided to
31 the state by the vendor the liquor and cannabis board has contracted
32 with in order to track marijuana from seed to sale under this
33 chapter.
- 34 (5) This section expires June 30, 2020.
