- 1 AN ACT Relating to uncovered tires; amending RCW 46.37.500; and
- 2 creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** By addressing gaps in current law, the
- 5 legislature intends to protect pedestrians, drivers, and vehicles
- 6 from rocks and debris that can be jettisoned by vehicles with
- 7 uncovered tires.
- 8 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.37.500 and 2016 c 22 s 6 are each amended to read
- 9 as follows: 10 (1) Except as authorized under subsection (2) of this section, no
- 11 person may operate any motor vehicle, trailer, cargo extension, or
- 12 semitrailer that is not equipped with fenders, covers, flaps, or
- 13 splash aprons adequate for minimizing the spray or splash of water
- 14 $((\frac{\partial r}{\partial r}))$, mud, or rocks from the roadway to the rear of the vehicle.
- 15 All such devices shall be as wide as the tires behind <u>and above</u> which
- 16 they are mounted and extend downward at least to the center of the
- 17 axle. <u>If there is no preventative device for minimizing the spray or</u>
- 18 splash of water, mud, or rocks from the roadway, tires may not be
- 19 wider than the wheel well of the vehicle and may not extend outside
- 20 of the wheel well.

(2) A motor vehicle that is not less than forty years old or a street rod vehicle that is owned and operated primarily as a collector's item need not be equipped with fenders when the vehicle is used and driven during fair weather on well-maintained, hard-surfaced roads.
