1 AN ACT Relating to capital budget; making appropriations and
2 authorizing expenditures for capital improvements; amending RCW

17 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A supplemental capital budget is hereby
18 adopted and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the
19 several dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as
20 shall be sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
21 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects

1 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
2 ending June 30, 2021, out of the several funds specified in this act.

11 (1) \$1,455,000 of the amount reappropriated in this section is
12 provided solely for the Byrd Barr place, formerly known as
13 Centerstone, building renovation project.

14 (2) \$220,000 of the amount reappropriated in this section is
15 provided solely for El Centro de la Raza boiler fan and master plan
16 for rehabilitation. This amount is not subject to the match
17 requirements, pursuant to RCW 43.63A.125.

32 reappropriations are subject to the provisions of section 6005 ~~((of~~
33 ~~this act))~~, chapter 413, Laws of 2019.

34 (2) \$1,000,000 of the Washington housing trust account—state
35 reappropriation from section 6005(1)(e), chapter 413, Laws of 2019

1 and \$1,500,000 of the state taxable building construction account—
 2 state reappropriation from section 6005(1)(e), chapter 413, Laws of
 3 2019 are instead provided solely for the purchase of the two south
 4 annex properties. The state board for community and technical
 5 colleges must transfer the two south annex properties located at 1534
 6 Broadway and 909 East Pine street in Seattle to Capitol Hill Housing
 7 to provide services and housing for homeless youth or young adults
 8 for a minimum of fifty years. The transfer agreement between the
 9 state board for community and technical colleges and Capitol Hill

31 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following
 32 conditions and limitations:

33 (1) \$129,050,000 of the state taxable building construction
 34 account—state appropriation and (~~(\$45,950,000)~~) \$46,950,000 of the
 35 state building construction account—state appropriation are provided
 36 solely for production and preservation of affordable housing. Of the
 37 amounts in this subsection:

1 (a) \$35,000,000 of the appropriation is provided solely for
2 housing projects that provide supportive housing and case-management
3 services to persons with (~~behavioral or~~) chronic mental illness.
4 When evaluating applications for this population, the department must
5 prioritize low-income supportive housing unit proposals that show:

6 (i) Evidence that the application was developed in collaboration
7 with one or more health care entities that provide behavioral health
8 care services to individuals eligible for the housing provided under
9 this subsection;

10 (ii) A commitment by the applicant to provide, directly or
11 through a formal partnership, necessary treatment and supportive
12 services to the tenants and maintain the beds or housing units for at
13 least a forty-year period;

14 (iii) Readiness to begin structural modifications or construction
15 resulting in a fast project completion;

16 (iv) Program requirements that adhere to the key elements of
17 permanent supportive housing programs including choice in housing and
18 living arrangements, functional separation of housing and services,
19 community integration, rights of tenancy, and voluntary recovery-
20 focused services; and

21 (v) To achieve geographic distribution, the department must
22 prioritize projects in rural areas as defined by the department per
23 RCW 43.185.050 and unserved communities with the goal of maximizing
24 the investment and increasing the number of supportive housing units
25 in rural, unserved communities.

26 (b) \$10,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
27 solely for competitive grant awards for modular housing which
28 includes high quality affordable housing projects that will quickly
29 move people from homelessness into secure housing and are
30 significantly less expensive to construct than traditional housing.
31 These funds must be awarded to projects with a total project
32 development cost per housing unit of less than \$125,000, excluding
33 the value of land, off-site infrastructure costs, and any capitalized
34 reserves, compliant with the Americans with disabilities act, and
35 with a commitment by the applicant to maintain the housing units for
36 at least a fifty year period.

37 (c) \$10,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
38 solely for a state match or state matches on private contributions
39 that fund the production and preservation of affordable housing.
40 Awards must be made using a competitive process. If any funding

1 remains unallocated after the first fiscal year during the 2019-2021
2 fiscal biennium, the department may allocate the remaining funding
3 through its annual competitive process for affordable housing
4 projects that serve and benefit low-income and special needs
5 populations in need of housing.

6 (d) (i) \$10,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is
7 provided solely for housing preservation grants or loans to be
8 awarded competitively.

9 (ii) The funds may be provided for major building improvements,
10 preservation, and system replacements, necessary for the existing
11 housing trust fund portfolio to maintain long-term viability. The
12 department must require a capital needs assessment to be provided
13 prior to contract execution. Funds may not be used to add or expand
14 the capacity of the property.

15 (iii) To allocate preservation funds, the department must review
16 applications and evaluate projects based on the following criteria:

17 (A) The age of the property, with priority given to buildings
18 that are more than fifteen years old;

19 (B) The population served, with priority given to projects with
20 at least 50 percent of the housing units being occupied by families
21 and individuals at or below 50 percent area median income;

22 (C) The degree to which the applicant demonstrates that the
23 improvements will result in a reduction of operating or utilities
24 costs, or both;

25 (D) The potential for additional years added to the affordability
26 period of the property; and

27 (E) Other criteria that the department considers necessary to
28 achieve the purpose of this program.

29 (e) (i) \$7,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is
30 provided solely for loans or grants to design and construct ultra-
31 high energy efficient affordable housing projects.

32 (ii) To receive funding, a project must provide a life-cycle cost
33 analysis report to the department and must demonstrate energy-saving
34 and renewable energy systems either designed to reach net-zero energy
35 use after housing is fully occupied or designed to achieve the most
36 recent building standard of the passive house institute US as of the
37 effective date of this section.

38 (iii) The department must consider, at a minimum and in any
39 order, the following factors in assigning a numerical ranking to a
40 project:

1 (A) Whether the proposed design has demonstrated that the project
2 will achieve either net-zero energy use when fully occupied or will
3 achieve the most recent building standard of the passive house
4 institute US as of the effective date of this section;

5 (B) The life-cycle cost of the project;

6 (C) That the project demonstrates a design, use of materials, and
7 construction process that can be replicated by the Washington
8 building industry;

9 (D) The extent to which the project leverages nonstate funds;

10 (E) The extent to which the project is ready to proceed to
11 construction;

12 (F) Whether the project promotes sustainable use of resources and
13 environmental quality;

14 (G) Whether the project is being well managed to fund maintenance
15 and capital depreciation;

16 (H) Reduction of housing and utilities carbon footprint; and

17 (I) Other criteria that the department considers necessary to
18 achieve the purpose of this program.

19 (iv) The department must monitor and track the results of the
20 housing projects that receive ultra-high energy efficiency funding
21 under this section.

5 (g) \$6,000,000 of the appropriation for Capitol Hill Housing
6 Broadway (Seattle) in (f) of this subsection is provided solely for
7 the purchase of the two south annex properties. The state board for
8 community and technical colleges must transfer the two south annex
9 properties located at 1534 Broadway and 909 East Pine street in
10 Seattle to Capitol Hill Housing to provide services and housing for
11 homeless youth or young adults for a minimum of fifty years. The
12 transfer agreement between the state board for community and
13 technical colleges and Capitol Hill Housing must specify a mutually
14 agreed transfer date and require Capitol Hill Housing to cover any
15 closing costs with a total purchase price of nine million dollars for
16 the two properties. The contract between the department and Capitol
17 Hill Housing must provide that Capitol Hill Housing will be
18 responsible for maintaining and securing the property until it is
19 developed. The contract must also specify that, if Capitol Hill
20 Housing does not construct at least seventy affordable housing units
21 on the site by 2028, this funding must be fully repaid to the state
22 or the land must revert back to the state.

23 (h) \$57,050,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
24 solely for affordable housing projects that serve and benefit low-
25 income and special needs populations in need of housing. Of the
26 amounts appropriated in this subsection, the department must allocate
27 the funds as follows:

28 (i) \$5,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
29 solely for housing for veterans;

30 (ii) \$5,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
31 solely for housing that serves people with developmental
32 disabilities;

33 (iii) \$5,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
34 solely for housing that serves people who are employed as
35 farmworkers; and

36 (iv) (A) \$5,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is
37 provided solely for housing projects that benefit homeownership.

38 (B) During the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium, the department must use
39 a separate application form for applications to provide homeownership

1 opportunities and evaluate homeownership project applications as
2 allowed under chapter 43.185A RCW.

3 (C) In addition to the definition of "first-time home buyer" in
4 RCW 43.185A.010, for the purposes of awarding homeownership projects
5 during the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium "first time home buyer" also
6 includes:

7 (I) A single parent who has only owned a home with a former
8 spouse while married;

9 (II) An individual who is a displaced homemaker as defined in 24
10 C.F.R. Sec. 93.2 as it existed on the effective date of this section,
11 or such subsequent date as may be provided by the department by rule,
12 consistent with the purposes of this section, and has only owned a
13 home with a spouse;

14 (III) An individual who has only owned a principal residence not
15 permanently affixed to a permanent foundation in accordance with
16 applicable regulations; or

17 (IV) An individual who has only owned a property that is
18 discerned by a licensed building inspector as being uninhabitable.

19 (2) In evaluating projects in this section, the department must
20 give preference for applications based on some or all of the criteria
21 in RCW 43.185.070(5).

22 (3)(a) The department must strive to allocate all of the amounts
23 appropriated in this section within the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium in
24 the manner prescribed in subsection (1) of this section. However, if
25 upon review of applications the department determines there are not
26 adequate suitable projects in a category, the department may allocate
27 funds to projects serving other low-income and special needs
28 populations, provided those projects are located in an area with an
29 identified need for the type of housing proposed.

30 (b) By June 30, 2021, the department must report on its web site
31 the following for every previous funding cycle: The number of
32 homeownership and multifamily rental projects funded by housing trust
33 fund moneys; the percentage of housing trust fund investments made to
34 homeownership and multifamily rental projects; and the total number
35 of households being served at up to eighty percent of the area median
36 income, up to fifty percent of the area median income, and up to
37 thirty percent of the area median income, for both homeownership and
38 multifamily rental projects.

39 (4)(a) The department, in cooperation with the housing finance
40 commission, must develop and implement a process for the collection

1 of certified final development cost data from each grant or loan
2 recipient under this section. The department must use this data as
3 part of its cost containment policy.

4 (b) Beginning December 1, 2019, and continuing annually, the
5 department must provide the legislature with a report of its final
6 cost data for each project under this section. Such cost data must,
7 at a minimum, include total development cost per unit for each
8 project completed within the past year, descriptive statistics such
9 as average and median per unit costs, regional cost variation, and
10 other costs that the department deems necessary to improve cost
11 controls and enhance understanding of development costs. The
12 department must coordinate with the housing finance commission to
13 identify relevant development costs data and ensure that the measures
14 are consistent across relevant agencies.

4 Clean Energy Transition 4 (40000042)

5 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following
6 conditions and limitations:

7 (1) The appropriations are provided solely for projects that
8 provide a benefit to the public through development, demonstration,
9 and deployment of clean energy technologies that save energy and
10 reduce energy costs, reduce harmful air emissions, or increase energy
11 independence for the state. Priority must be given to projects that
12 benefit vulnerable populations, including tribes and communities with
13 high environmental or energy burden.

14 (2) In soliciting and evaluating proposals, awarding contracts,
15 and monitoring projects under this section, the department must:

16 (a) Ensure that competitive processes, rather than sole source
17 contracting processes, are used to select all projects, except as
18 otherwise noted in this section; and

19 (b) Conduct due diligence activities associated with the use of
20 public funds including, but not limited to, oversight of the project
21 selection process, project monitoring, and ensuring that all
22 applications and contracts fully comply with all applicable laws
23 including disclosure and conflict of interest statutes.

24 (3)(a) Pursuant to chapter 42.52 RCW, the ethics in public
25 service act, the department must require a project applicant to
26 identify in application materials any state of Washington employees
27 or former state employees employed by the firm or on the firm's
28 governing board during the past twenty-four months. Application
29 materials must identify the individual by name, the agency previously
30 or currently employing the individual, job title or position held,
31 and separation date. If it is determined by the department that a
32 conflict of interest exists, the applicant may be disqualified from
33 further consideration for award of funding.

34 (b) If the department finds, after due notice and examination,
35 that there is a violation of chapter 42.52 RCW, or any similar
36 statute involving a grantee who received funding under this section,
37 either in procuring or performing under the grant, the department in
38 its sole discretion may terminate the funding grant by written
39 notice. If the grant is terminated, the department must reserve its

1 right to pursue all available remedies under law to address the
2 violation.

3 (4) The requirements in subsections (2) and (3) of this section
4 must be specified in funding agreements issued by the department.

5 (5) \$6,107,000 of the state building construction account—state
6 appropriation is provided solely for grid modernization grants for
7 projects that: Advance clean and renewable energy technologies and
8 transmission and distribution control systems; support integration of
9 renewable energy sources, deployment of distributed energy resources,
10 and sustainable microgrids; and increase utility customer options for
11 energy sources, energy efficiency, energy equipment, and utility
12 services.

13 (a) Projects must be implemented by public and private electrical
14 utilities that serve retail customers in the state. Priority must be
15 given to: (i) Projects that benefit vulnerable populations, including
16 tribes and communities with high environmental or energy burden; and
17 (ii) projects that have a partner that is a tribe or nonprofit
18 organization that serves community eligible entities. Utilities may
19 partner with other public and private sector research organizations,
20 businesses, tribes, and nonprofit organizations in applying for
21 funding.

22 (b) The department shall develop a grant application process to
23 competitively select projects for grant awards, to include scoring
24 conducted by a group of qualified experts with application of
25 criteria specified by the department. In development of the
26 application criteria, the department shall, to the extent possible,
27 allow smaller utilities or consortia of small utilities to apply for
28 funding.

29 (c) Applications for grants must disclose all sources of public
30 funds invested in a project.

31 (d) \$4,400,000 of the state building construction account—state
32 appropriation is provided solely for providing shore power
33 electrification at terminal five for the northwest seaport alliance.
34 In order to receive this grant, the northwest seaport alliance must
35 demonstrate that they applied to the VW settlement for this project
36 and were denied.

37 (6) (a) \$8,100,000 of the state building construction account—
38 state appropriation is provided solely for competitive grants for
39 strategic research and development for new and emerging clean energy

1 technologies. These grants will be used to match federal or other
2 nonstate funds to research, develop, and demonstrate clean energy
3 technologies.

4 (b) The department shall consult and coordinate with the
5 University of Washington, Washington State University, the Pacific
6 Northwest national laboratory and other clean energy organizations to
7 design the grant program. Clean energy organizations who compete for
8 grants from the program may not participate in the design of the
9 grant program. Criteria for the grant program must include life cycle
10 cost analysis for projects that are part of the competitive process.

11 (c) The program may include, but is not limited to: Solar
12 technologies, advanced bioenergy and biofuels, development of new
13 earth abundant materials or lightweight materials, advanced energy
14 storage, battery components recycling, and new renewable energy and
15 energy efficiency technologies.

16 (d) \$1,000,000 of the state building construction account—state
17 appropriation is provided solely for grants that enhance the
18 viability of dairy digester bioenergy projects, energy efficiency,
19 and resource recovery to demonstrate advanced nutrient recovery
20 systems that produce value added biofertilizers, reduce trucking of
21 lagoon water, and improve soil health and air and water quality.
22 Grants shall include at least one project east of the Cascades and
23 one project west of the Cascades. State agencies must promote and
24 demonstrate the use of such recovered biofertilizers through state
25 procurement and contracts.

26 (7) (a) \$3,000,000 of the state taxable building construction
27 account—state appropriation is provided solely as grants to nonprofit
28 lenders to create a revolving loan fund to support the widespread use
29 of proven energy efficiency and renewable energy technologies by
30 households with high energy burden or environmental health risk now
31 inhibited by lack of access to capital.

32 (b) The department shall provide grant funds to one or more
33 competitively selected nonprofit lenders that will provide matching
34 private capital and will administer the loan fund. The department
35 must select the loan fund administrator or administrators through a
36 competitive process, with scoring conducted by a group of qualified
37 experts, applying criteria specified by the department.

38 (c) The department must establish guidelines that specify
39 applicant eligibility, the screening process, and evaluation and

1 selection criteria. The guidelines must be used by the nonprofit
2 lenders.

3 (8) \$5,000,000 of the state building construction account—state
4 appropriation is provided solely for the Washington Maritime
5 Innovation Center. The center must be used to support technology
6 acceleration and incubation, and act as a focal point for maritime
7 sustainability, including, but not limited to, supporting technology
8 development for maritime decarbonization and electrification.

9 (9) \$8,300,000 of the state taxable construction account—state
10 appropriation is provided solely for scientific instruments to help
11 accelerate research in grid-scale energy storage at the proposed
12 grid-scale energy storage research, development, and testing facility
13 at the Pacific Northwest national laboratory. The state funds are
14 contingent on securing federal funds for the new facility, and are
15 provided as a match to the federal funding. The instruments will
16 support collaborations with the University of Washington and the
17 Washington State University.

18 (10) \$593,000 of the state building construction account—state
19 appropriation is provided solely to the port of Grays Harbor for an
20 offshore ocean wave renewable energy demonstration project.

21 (11) \$1,500,000 of the state building construction account—state
22 appropriation is provided solely to the ((Port of)) Skagit county
23 public works department for the Guemes ferry dock shore power
24 charging infrastructure.

1 (1) The appropriation in this section is provided solely for the
2 department of commerce to issue grants to community hospitals or

32 providers to increase behavioral health services and capacity for

16 county capital facilities account may be appropriated for costs
17 associated with staffing to support capital budget and project
18 activities and lease and facility oversight activities.

19 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7004.** A new section is added to 2019 c 413
20 (uncodified) to read as follows:

21 The department of social and health services may enter into a
22 long-term, revenue generating lease for up to seven acres of the
23 fircrest residential habilitation center bounded by 15th Ave NE and
24 NE 150th Street and B Street to benefit the charitable, educational,
25 penal, and reformatory trust and support capital investment at the
26 residential habilitation center. The department of social and health
27 services and the department of natural resources must amend their
28 lease if necessary to conform with this section.

29 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7005.** A new section is added to 2019 c 413
30 (uncodified) to read as follows:

31 In order to accelerate the reduction of embodied carbon and
32 improve the environmental performance of construction materials,
33 agencies shall, whenever possible, review and consider embodied
34 carbon reported in environmental product declarations when evaluating
35 proposed structural materials for construction projects.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7006.** If any provision of this act or its
2 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
3 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
4 persons or circumstances is not affected.

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7007.** This act is necessary for the immediate
6 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of
7 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes
8 effect immediately.
