- 1 AN ACT Relating to daylight saving time in Washington state;
- 2 amending RCW 1.20.051 and 35A.21.190; creating a new section;
- 3 repealing RCW 1.20.050; and providing a contingent effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- The legislature finds that the state of 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. 6 Washington would benefit from the consistency and predictability of 7 observing a standard time throughout the calendar year. Research has shown that changing to and from daylight saving time twice per year 8 has negative impacts on public health, increases traffic accidents 9 10 and crime, disrupts agriculture scheduling, and hinders economic Scientific studies have connected a 11 number of 12 consequences with the act of switching between standard time and 13 daylight saving time, including greater risks of heart attacks, more 14 frequent workplace injuries, and increased suicide rates in the days 15 immediately following the switch. In addition, there have been other 16 political subdivisions within the United States that are petitioning 17 congress for year-round daylight saving time or changed their time 18 zone over the years to create more consistency across the United for convenience of commerce. 19 Therefore, the legislature 20 intends to observe daylight saving time year-round if authorized by 21 the United States congress; and also review the potential impact the

- 15 (2) Permanent daylight saving time within the state is that of
- 16 the fifth zone designated by federal law as Pacific standard time, 15
- 17 <u>U.S.C. Secs. 261 and 263, advanced by one hour.</u>
- 18 **Sec. 3.** RCW 35A.21.190 and 1967 ex.s. c 119 s 35A.21.190 are
- 19 each amended to read as follows:
- No code city shall adopt any provision for the observance of
- 21 daylight saving time other than as authorized by RCW ((1.20.050 and))
- 22 1.20.051.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. RCW 1.20.050 (Standard time—Daylight
- 24 saving time) and 1953 c 2 s 1 are each repealed.
- 25 NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. (1) Section 2 of this act takes effect on
- 26 the second Sunday in March in the year following the effective date
- 27 of legislation passed by United States congress amending 15 U.S.C.
- 28 Secs. 260a to authorize states to observe daylight saving time year-
- 29 round.
- 30 (2) The department of commerce must provide notice of the
- 31 effective date of section 2 of this act to affected parties, the
- 32 chief clerk of the house of representatives, the secretary of the
- 33 senate, the office of the code reviser, and others as deemed
- 34 appropriate by the department.
