1 AN ACT Relating to creating a San Juan Islands stewardship
2 special license plate; amending RCW 46.18.200, 46.17.220, and
3 46.68.420; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW; and providing
4 an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.18.200 and 2018 c 67 s 5 are each amended to read
7 as follows:

8 (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the
9 department:

10 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized
11 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license
12 plates unless otherwise specified;

13 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the
14 department;

15 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter
16 46.87 RCW; and

17 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

18 (2) The department approves and shall issue the following special
19 license plates:

31 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
32 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
33 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
34 state council of firefighters.

35 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license
36 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten
37 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)
38 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate

1 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting
 2 service before ten years of service have been completed, the
 3 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the
 4 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer
 5 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,
 6 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter
 7 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will
 8 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying
 9 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates
 10 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their
 11 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a
 12 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be
 13 surrendered upon conviction.

14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2018 c 67 s 4 are each amended to read
 15 as follows:

16 In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon
 17 application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the
 18 holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special
 19 license plate fee as listed in this section.

15 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2018 c 67 s 2 are each amended to read
16 as follows:

- 17 (1) The department shall:
- 18 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW
19 46.17.220;
- 20 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial
21 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and
22 collection expenses incurred by it; and
- 23 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state
24 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.
- 25 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor
26 vehicle account until the department determines that the state has
27 been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license
28 plate. Upon determination by the department that the state has been
29 reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special
30 license plate fee amounts for each special license plate to the
31 following appropriate account as created in this section in the
32 custody of the state treasurer:

9 courts. Funds for construction
10 must first be made available to the
11 most populous eligible city,
12 according to the most recent
13 census, for a time period not to
14 exceed five years after January 1,
15 2017. After the five-year time
16 period, the funds for construction
17 must be made available to the
18 next most populous eligible city.
19 Funds for the maintenance of a
20 public tennis facility with at least
21 four indoor tennis courts must
22 first be made available to the first
23 eligible city that utilizes funds for
24 construction provided by chapter
25 16, Laws of 2016

7 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, only the
8 director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from
9 the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The
10 accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW,
11 but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.

12 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this section, funds in the
13 special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this
14 section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in
15 subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the
16 department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the
17 services described in subsection (2) of this section.

18 (5) Funds from the Seattle Seahawks account may be provided to
19 the lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the
20 Washington world fellows program. Of the amounts received by the
21 lieutenant governor's office under this subsection, at least ninety
22 percent must be provided as fellowships under the program.

23 (6) Beginning January 1, 2019, funds from the Seattle Mariners
24 account may be provided to the office of lieutenant governor solely
25 for the purpose of administering the sports mentoring program. Of the
26 amounts received by the office of lieutenant governor, at least
27 ninety percent must be applied towards services directly provided to
28 youth participants.

29 (7) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit
30 organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in
31 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status
32 under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization
33 must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04
35 RCW to read as follows:

36 "San Juan Islands stewardship license plates" means license
37 plates issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display a symbol or artwork

1 recognizing the efforts of San Juan Islands stewardship programs in
2 Washington state.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** This act takes effect October 1, 2019.
