- 1 AN ACT Relating to resentencing persistent offenders; creating a new section; and providing an expiration date.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- Sec. 1. (1) In any criminal case wherein an 4 NEW SECTION. 5 offender has been sentenced as a persistent offender before July 28, 6 2019, the offender must have a resentencing hearing if a current or 7 past conviction for robbery in the second degree was used as a basis for the finding that the offender was a persistent offender. The 8 prosecuting attorney for the county in which any offender was 9 10 sentenced as a persistent offender shall review each sentencing document. If a current or past conviction for robbery in the second 11 degree was used as a basis for a finding that an offender was a 12 13 persistent offender, the prosecuting attorney shall, or the offender 14 may, make a motion for relief from sentence to the original 15 sentencing court.
 - (2) The sentencing court shall grant the motion if it finds that a current or past conviction for robbery in the second degree was used as a basis for a finding that the offender was a persistent offender and shall immediately set an expedited date for resentencing. At resentencing, the court shall sentence the offender
