- 1 AN ACT Relating to foster care licensing following a foster-
- 2 family home licensee's move to a new location; amending RCW
- 3 74.15.100; and creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that at least fortysix foster home licenses were closed between 2017 and 2019 due to failure to notify the department of children, youth, and families of
- 8 a change of residence within thirty days of relocation. In
- 9 recognition of the importance of maintaining foster placements in
- 10 Washington, the legislature intends to provide licensing continuation
- 11 for foster families without a foster child in their care at the time
- 12 of relocation if the licensee meets minimum licensing standards and
- 13 completes a home inspection within thirty days of providing notice of
- 14 relocation.
- 15 **Sec. 2.** RCW 74.15.100 and 2018 c 284 s 68 are each amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 Each agency shall make application for a license or renewal of
- 18 license to the department on forms prescribed by the department. A
- 19 licensed agency having foster-family homes under its supervision may
- 20 make application for a license on behalf of any such foster-family

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home. Such a foster home license shall cease to be valid when the 1 home is no longer under the supervision of that agency. Upon receipt 2 3 of such application, the department shall either grant or deny a license within ninety days unless the application is for licensure as 4 a foster-family home, in which case RCW 74.15.040 shall govern. A 5 6 license shall be granted if the agency meets the minimum requirements set forth in this chapter ((74.15 RCW)) and RCW 74.13.031 and the 7 departmental requirements consistent herewith, except that an initial 8 license may be issued as provided in RCW 74.15.120. Licenses provided 9 for in this chapter ((74.15 RCW)) and RCW 74.13.031 shall be issued 10 for a period of three years. The licensee, however, shall advise the 11 12 secretary of any material change in circumstances which might constitute grounds for reclassification of license as to category. 13 The license issued under this chapter is not transferable and applies 14 only to the licensee. The license shall be limited to a particular 15 16 location which shall be stated on the license. For licensed foster-17 family homes having an acceptable history of child care, the license may remain in effect for thirty days after a move, except that this 18 19 will apply only if the family remains intact and children are placed in their care. Licensees must notify their licensor before moving to 20 21 a new location and may request a continuation of the license at the new location. ((At the request of the licensee, the department shall, 22 23 within thirty days following a foster-family home licensee's move to a new location, amend the license to reflect the new location, 24 25 provided the new location and the licensee meet)) The department shall conduct a home inspection following notification that a foster-26 27 family home has moved to a new location. Provided the new location 28 and licensees meet minimum licensing standards, the licensor shall amend the license to reflect the new location. Licensees whose family 29 30 remains intact and have no children placed in their care at the time 31 of a move to a new location shall notify their licensor within ninety 32 days of moving. If the licensee is in good standing at the time of the move, the licensor shall place the home on no-referral status and 33 34 complete a home inspection within thirty days of notification. Such licensees shall remain on no-referral status and no new placements 35 may be made in their home until the inspection is complete and the 36 licensor determines that the new location meets minimum licensing 37 38 standards.
