

**ESHB 1368 - S AMD 48**

**NOT ADOPTED 02/10/2021**

1 On page 12, line 14, increase the General Fund—Federal  
2 Appropriation by \$156,722,000

3 Adjust the total appropriation accordingly.

4 On page 12, line 18, after "(1)" strike "\$668,130,000" and insert  
5 "\$824,852,000"

6 On page 12, line 25, after "division M" insert "and consistent  
7 with the provisions of this section"

8 On page 13, after line 38, insert the following:

9 "(4) (a) One hundred percent of the subgrant must be allocated to  
10 any school district, charter school, or state-tribal education  
11 compact school that on the effective date of this section is open for  
12 in-person instruction for all grades.

13 (b) For any school district, charter school, or state-tribal  
14 education compact school that is not open or only partially open for  
15 in-person instruction, funds must be allocated as follows:

16 (i) Fifty percent of the subgrant must be allocated to the school  
17 district, charter school, or state-tribal education compact school  
18 upon the receipt of the school reopening plan required by subsection  
19 (2) (a) of this section; and

20 (ii) The remaining 50 percent of the subgrant must be allocated  
21 to the school district, charter school, or state-tribal education  
22 compact school in proportion to the amount of in-person instruction  
23 being provided to students. The superintendent must reassess this  
24 proportion monthly, consistent with the timing of apportionment  
25 payments, and make additional allocations as necessary. This phased  
26 distribution of allocations is intended to increase funding as  
27 schools reopen or expand in-person instruction, and to reserve  
28 funding for those purposes if a school district, charter school, or  
29 state-tribal education compact school does not completely reopen for  
30 the 2020-21 school year."

EFFECT: Increases the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction appropriations for subgrants from the federal Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER). Ties half of ESSER funding to schools to submittal of a reopening plan and the other half to the proportion of in-person instruction being provided to students. The proportion is reviewed monthly to allow additional allocations.
