

**2SHB 1827 - S AMD 1391**

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the  
2 following:

3 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that there is a  
4 behavioral health crisis in communities across our state. In order to  
5 improve racial, economic, and social disparities, this crisis must be  
6 addressed and requires aggressive and targeted resources directed  
7 toward community-led efforts.

8 Therefore, the legislature intends to transfer an amount no less  
9 than \$125,000,000 per year into the community reinvestment account  
10 for community investments in behavioral health and drug courts.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.79  
12 RCW to read as follows:

13 The community reinvestment account is created in the state  
14 treasury. Moneys in the account may be spent only after  
15 appropriation. Expenditures from the account may only be made by the  
16 health care authority to:

- 17 (1) Provide funding, on a per capita basis, to behavioral health  
18 administrative services organizations, as defined in RCW 71.24.025,  
19 for the purposes of providing substance use disorder treatment,  
20 prevention, and recovery services including, but not limited to,  
21 diversion, residential treatment, community and peer support  
22 services, supported housing and employment, and crisis response; and  
23 (2) Support drug courts, following the distribution method for  
24 the criminal justice treatment account created in RCW 71.24.580(5)."

1        On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "program;" strike the  
2 remainder of the title and insert "adding a new section to chapter  
3 43.79 RCW; and creating a new section."

EFFECT: Strikes the underlying bill in its entirety. Creates the Community Reinvestment Account to be used for community substance use disorder treatment, prevention, and recovery services, and for enhanced state support of drug courts.
