Title: An act relating to prohibiting the feeding of garbage to swine.

Brief Description: Prohibiting the feeding of garbage to swine.

Brief Summary of Bill

- Prohibits feeding garbage to swine.
- Removes the license provisions related to feeding garbage to swine.
- Defines garbage to be all waste material derived in whole or in part from the meat of an animal, including fish and poultry.

Background: The Director of the Washington State Department of Agriculture (WSDA) is authorized to adopt rules that prevent the introduction of spreading of infectious diseases into the state. This includes the authority to adopt rules regarding the inspection and testing of all animals in the state or being imported into the state.

The animal health program, administered by WSDA, exists to protect the people of the state, their livestock, and other animals from harmful animal diseases. The program administers livestock disease eradication programs in cooperation with United States

Department of Agriculture and regulates the movement and testing of animals coming into the state and being sold within the state.

Feeding garbage to swine requires a license from the director. The fee for the license is \$10 and the license expires on June 30th of each year. The license is nontransferable and a separate license is required for each place of business if an operator has more than one feeding station. When issuing a license to a person to feed garbage to swine, the director must inspect the premises and determine that the applicant meets the requirements of state and federal rules regarding such feeding. A person feeding garbage to swine from their household is not required to obtain a license.

Summary of Bill: Feeding garbage to swine is prohibited. Provisions related to obtaining a license to feed garbage to swine are removed.

The definition of garbage is amended to be all waste material derived in whole or in part from the meat of an animal, including fish and poultry, or other animal material, and other refuse of any character whatsoever that has been associated with any such material, resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking, or consumption of food.
