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**SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1306**

1 AN ACT Relating to bond authorization training for school  
2 district boards of directors; adding a new section to chapter 28A.525  
3 RCW; creating a new section; and providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that local school  
6 district boards of directors have the authority to put capital bond  
7 votes before their voters, but often lack the basic understanding of  
8 legal requirements related to public works projects. Better informed  
9 school boards of directors are likely to take greater responsibility  
10 in selecting responsible contractors and enforcing public works legal  
11 obligations. Better understanding of public works obligations and  
12 opportunities may lead to lower overall project costs, more money  
13 retained locally, and opportunities to develop a workforce pipeline  
14 for family-wage jobs and careers within the community.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.525  
16 RCW to read as follows:

17 (1) Prior to approving a bond authorization for voter  
18 consideration, any member of a school district board of directors  
19 voting to approve that bond authorization must have received training  
20 on basic legal requirements and opportunities of public sector

1 capital projects. Any member of a school district board of directors  
2 voting to approve a bond authorization for voter consideration must  
3 have received the training required by this section in the six-year  
4 period preceding their vote. This training must include, but is not  
5 limited to:

6 (a) Apprenticeship utilization requirements;

7 (b) Prevailing wage requirements; and

8 (c) The opportunity for school districts, general contractors,  
9 and labor organizations to provide perspectives on project labor  
10 agreements and community workforce agreements.

11 (2) School districts and educational service districts are  
12 encouraged to provide the required training under subsection (1) of  
13 this section using a regional model with the assistance and materials  
14 provided by the Washington state department of labor and industries,  
15 labor organizations, and associations representing general  
16 contractors.

17 (3) In partnership with the Washington state department of labor  
18 and industries, labor organizations, and associations representing  
19 general contractors, the Washington state school directors'  
20 association shall draft a model policy and procedure to meet the  
21 training requirements established by this section.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** This act takes effect September 1, 2022.

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
