1 AN ACT Relating to allowable uses for the multiuse roadway safety
2 account; and amending RCW 46.09.540.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.09.540 and 2013 2nd sp.s. c 23 s 10 are each
5 amended to read as follows:

6 (1) The multiuse roadway safety account is created in the motor
7 vehicle fund. All receipts from vehicle license fees under RCW
8 46.17.350(1)(r) must be deposited into the account. Moneys in the
9 account may be spent only after appropriation. Expenditures from the
10 account may be used only for grants administered by the department of
11 transportation to: (a) Counties to perform safety engineering
12 analysis of mixed vehicle use on any road within a county; (b) local
13 governments to provide funding to erect signs providing notice to the
14 motoring public that (i) wheeled all-terrain vehicles are present or
15 (ii) wheeled all-terrain vehicles may be crossing; (c) the state
16 patrol or local law enforcement for purposes of defraying the costs
17 of enforcement of chapter 23, Laws of 2013 2nd sp. sess.; ~~((and))~~ (d)
18 law enforcement to investigate accidents involving wheeled all-
19 terrain vehicles; (e) counties to enhance or maintain any segment of
20 a road within the county in which the segment has been designated as
21 part of a travel or tourism route for use by wheeled all-terrain

1 vehicles; and (f) purchase, print, develop, or use educational
2 brochures or mapping technology that aids in the safety and direction
3 of users of wheeled all-terrain vehicle routes.

4 (2) The department of transportation must prioritize grant awards
5 in the following priority order:

6 (a) For the purpose of marking highway crossings with signs
7 warning motorists that wheeled all-terrain vehicles may be crossing
8 when an ORV recreation facility parking lot is on the other side of a
9 public roadway from the actual ORV recreation facility; and

10 (b) For the purpose of marking intersections with signs where a
11 wheeled all-terrain vehicle may cross a public road to advise
12 motorists of the upcoming intersection. Such signs must conform to
13 the manual on uniform traffic control devices.
