- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON: 3
- RCW 46.16A.230 and 2020 c 118 s 1 are each amended to 4 Sec. 1. 5 read as follows:
 - governor may enter into compacts with recognized Indian tribes principally located within this state concerning the licensing and registration of tribal government vehicles, vehicles owned by individuals who are designated by a tribal government, and tribal member-owned vehicles, with tribal license plates issued by the department.
- 12 (2) Each compact entered into under this section must contain the 13 following provisions:
- 14 (a) The design of a tribal license plate or plates shall be 15 determined by the compacting tribe or a tribally chartered nonprofit 16 designated by the compacting tribe, except that the design must be 17 readable by toll collection facilities and configured in a manner 18 allowing for electronic distribution through state and national law 19 enforcement databases;
- 20 (b) Tribal license plate recipients must pay all applicable 21 taxes, fees, and vehicle tolls, except that the compacting tribe may

1 pay these expenses on behalf of its enrolled members as provided in 2 the compact;

- (c) That the eligibility for a tribal license plate is limited to tribal governments, individuals designated by a tribal government who reside in the state, and enrolled members of the compacting tribe who reside in the state, and that the compact may address additional requirements;
- 8 (d) Information regarding a vehicle that has been issued a tribal 9 license plate, including vehicle description and ownership 10 information, be maintained in the department's recordkeeping systems.
 - (3) Each compact must also address the following subjects:
- 12 (a) The department's administrative costs for issuing tribal 13 license plates and maintaining information regarding vehicles that 14 have been issued tribal license plates;
- 15 (b) Information sharing between the department and the compacting 16 tribe;
- 17 (c) The process for applying for and receiving tribal license 18 plates; and
- 19 (d) Dispute resolution, including the use of mediation or other 20 nonjudicial process.
- 21 (4) The governor may delegate the power to negotiate compacts 22 under this section to the department.
