- 1 AN ACT Relating to protecting the right of every Washington
- 2 resident to decline an immunization or vaccination for COVID-19; and
- 3 adding a new section to chapter 70.54 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 70.54 6 RCW to read as follows:
- 7 (1) No state agency or political subdivision of the state may 8 enact or issue a rule, ordinance, order, or any similar policy that 9 would result in an individual being required to submit to vaccination 10 or immunization for COVID-19 despite his or her religious, 11 philosophical, or personal objections.
- 12 (2) No state agency or political subdivision of the state may 13 take any other action that would result in an individual being required to submit to vaccination or immunization for COVID-19 14 despite his or her religious, philosophical, or personal objections 15 16 including, but not limited to, requiring vaccination or immunization 17 for COVID-19 as a condition of employment, access to education, 18 travel, entry to a public place, or contracting with a state agency 19 or political subdivision.
- 20 (3) No employer, school or university, transportation provider, 21 or any place of public resort, accommodation, assemblage, or

- amusement may require, directly or indirectly, any person to submit to vaccination or immunization for COVID-19.
- 3 (4) Any rule, ordinance, order, policy, or action enacted, 4 issued, or taken in violation of this section is null and void as 5 against the public policy of the state.
