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HOUSE BILL 2040

State of Washington 67th Legislature 2022 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to streamlining licensing requirements for
- 2 certain behavioral health professionals; amending RCW 18.225.090;
- 3 creating a new section; and providing an effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The legislature finds that Washington state is in the midst of a behavioral health crisis. Unmet demand for behavioral health services is leading to negative impacts on the health and well-being of many Washingtonians. One of the many causes of this unmet demand is the inadequate number of mental health professionals available to treat Washington residents with behavioral health needs.
 - (2) The legislature acknowledges the ongoing efforts by state agencies and stakeholders to streamline the licensing processes for certain behavioral health professionals. These efforts have, however, not yielded any meaningful increase in the number of such professionals.
- 17 (3) The legislature therefore intends to take action to 18 streamline the licensing process for these professionals by reducing 19 the number of hours of supervised experience required for full 20 licensure, beginning July 1, 2024. The legislature intends to revisit 21 this approach in light of any recommendations resulting from the

- 1 ongoing work of state agencies and stakeholders if those
- 2 recommendations are reported to the legislature prior to the 2024
- 3 regular legislative session.

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- 4 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.225.090 and 2021 c 21 s 1 are each amended to read as follows:
 - (1) The secretary shall issue a license to any applicant who demonstrates to the satisfaction of the secretary that the applicant meets the following education and experience requirements for the applicant's practice area.
 - (a) Licensed social work classifications:
 - (i) Licensed advanced social worker:
 - (A) Graduation from a master's or doctorate social work educational program accredited by the council on social work education and approved by the secretary based upon nationally recognized standards;
 - (B) Successful completion of an approved examination;
 - (C) Successful completion of a supervised experience requirement. The supervised experience requirement consists of a minimum of ((three thousand two hundred)) 1,600 hours with supervision by an approved supervisor who has been licensed for at least two years. Of those supervised hours:
 - (I) At least ((ninety)) <u>45</u> hours must include direct supervision as specified in this subsection by a licensed independent clinical social worker, a licensed advanced social worker, or an equally qualified licensed mental health professional. Of those hours of directly supervised experience:
 - (1) At least ((fifty)) 25 hours must include supervision by a licensed advanced social worker or licensed independent clinical social worker; the other ((forty)) 20 hours may be supervised by an equally qualified licensed mental health practitioner; and
- 31 (2) At least ((forty)) 20 hours must be in one-to-one supervision 32 and ((fifty)) 25 hours may be in one-to-one supervision or group 33 supervision; and
- 34 (II) ((Eight)) <u>Four</u> hundred hours must be in direct client 35 contact; and
- 36 (D) Successful completion of continuing education requirements of ((thirty-six)) 36 hours, with six in professional ethics.
 - (ii) Licensed independent clinical social worker:

- (A) Graduation from a master's or doctorate level social work educational program accredited by the council on social work education and approved by the secretary based upon nationally recognized standards;
 - (B) Successful completion of an approved examination;

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- 6 (C) Successful completion of a supervised experience requirement. The supervised experience requirement consists of a minimum of ((four 7 thousand)) 2,000 hours of experience, over a period of not less than 8 three years, with supervision by an approved supervisor who has been 9 licensed for at least two years and, as specified in this subsection, 10 may be either a licensed independent clinical social worker who has 11 12 had at least one year of experience in supervising the clinical social work of others or an equally qualified licensed mental health 13 practitioner. Of those supervised hours: 14
- 15 (I) At least ((one thousand)) <u>500</u> hours must be direct client 16 contact; and
 - (II) Hours of direct supervision must include:
 - (1) At least ((one hundred thirty)) <u>65</u> hours by a licensed mental health practitioner;
 - (2) At least ((seventy)) 35 hours of supervision with a licensed independent clinical social worker meeting the qualifications under this subsection (1)(a)(ii)(C); the other ((sixty)) 30 hours may be supervised by an equally qualified licensed mental health practitioner; and
 - (3) At least ((sixty)) 30 hours must be in one-to-one supervision and ((seventy)) 35 hours may be in one-to-one supervision or group supervision; and
 - (D) Successful completion of continuing education requirements of ((thirty-six)) 36 hours, with six in professional ethics.
 - (b) Licensed mental health counselor:
- 31 (i) Graduation from a master's or doctoral level educational 32 program in mental health counseling or a related discipline from a 33 college or university approved by the secretary based upon nationally 34 recognized standards;
 - (ii) Successful completion of an approved examination;
 - (iii) Successful completion of a supervised experience requirement. The experience requirement consists of a minimum of ((thirty-six)) 18 months full-time counseling or ((three thousand)) 1,500 hours of postgraduate mental health counseling under the supervision of a qualified licensed mental health counselor or

- equally qualified licensed mental health practitioner, in an approved setting. The ((three thousand)) 1,500 hours of required experience includes a minimum of ((one hundred)) 50 hours spent in immediate supervision with the qualified licensed mental health counselor, and includes a minimum of ((one thousand two hundred)) 600 hours of direct counseling with individuals, couples, families, or groups; and
- 7 (iv) Successful completion of continuing education requirements 8 of ((thirty-six)) 36 hours, with six in professional ethics.
 - (c) Licensed marriage and family therapist:

- (i) Graduation from a master's degree or doctoral degree educational program in marriage and family therapy or graduation from an educational program in an allied field equivalent to a master's degree or doctoral degree in marriage and family therapy approved by the secretary based upon nationally recognized standards;
 - (ii) Successful passage of an approved examination;
- (iii) Successful completion of a supervised experience requirement. The experience requirement consists of a minimum of ((two)) one calendar year((s)) of full-time marriage and family therapy. Of the total supervision, ((one hundred)) 50 hours must be with a licensed marriage and family therapist with at least five years' clinical experience; the other ((one hundred)) 50 hours may be with an equally qualified licensed mental health practitioner. Total experience requirements include:
- (A) A minimum of (($\frac{\text{three thousand}}{\text{thousand}}$)) $\frac{1,500}{\text{hours of experience}}$, (($\frac{\text{one thousand}}{\text{one thousand}}$)) $\frac{500}{\text{hours of which must be direct client contact; at least ((<math>\frac{\text{five hundred}}{\text{one thousand}}$)) $\frac{250}{\text{hours must be gained in diagnosing and treating couples and families; plus}}$
- (B) At least (($\frac{\text{two hundred}}{\text{hundred}}$)) $\frac{100}{\text{hours of qualified supervision}}$ with a supervisor. At least (($\frac{\text{one hundred}}{\text{hundred}}$)) $\frac{50}{\text{of the ((}\frac{\text{two hundred}}{\text{hours must be one-on-one supervision,}}$ and the remaining hours may be in one-on-one or group supervision.
- Applicants who have completed a master's program accredited by the commission on accreditation for marriage and family therapy education of the American association for marriage and family therapy may be credited with ((five hundred)) 250 hours of direct client contact and ((one hundred)) 50 hours of formal meetings with an approved supervisor; and
- 38 (iv) Successful completion of continuing education requirements of ((thirty-six)) 36 hours, with six in professional ethics.

(2) The department shall establish by rule what constitutes adequate proof of meeting the criteria. Only rules in effect on the date of submission of a completed application of an associate for her or his license shall apply. If the rules change after a completed application is submitted but before a license is issued, the new rules shall not be reason to deny the application.

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- 7 (3) In addition, applicants shall be subject to the grounds for 8 denial of a license or issuance of a conditional license under 9 chapter 18.130 RCW.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. Section 2 of this act takes effect July 1, 2024.
