AN ACT Relating to uniform standard time for the state of Washington; amending RCW 1.20.050 and 35A.21.190; amending 2019 c 297 s 4 (uncodified); creating a new section; repealing RCW 1.20.051; providing a contingent effective date; and providing a contingent s expiration date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the state of 7 NEW SECTION. Washington would benefit from the consistency and predictability of 8 observing a standard time throughout the calendar year. Research has 9 10 shown that changing to and from daylight saving time twice per year 11 has negative impacts on public health, increases traffic accidents 12 and crime, disrupts agriculture scheduling, and hinders economic 13 Scientific studies have connected a number of health growth. consequences with the act of switching between standard time and 14 15 daylight saving time, including greater risks of heart attacks, more 16 frequent workplace injuries, and increased suicide rates in the days immediately following the switch. In addition, there are other 17 political subdivisions within the United States that are petitioning 18 19 congress for year-round daylight saving time or have changed their 20 time zone over the years to create more consistency across the United 21 States for convenience of commerce. The legislature passed Substitute

1 House Bill No. 1196 in 2019 authorizing the state to observe daylight saving time year-round if authorized by the United States congress. 2 However, congress has not amended federal law to authorize states to 3 observe daylight saving time year-round. Therefore, the legislature 4 intends to exercise the rights granted under the uniform time act, 15 5 6 U.S.C. Sec. 260a(a), and exempt the state of Washington from the observance of daylight saving time and remain standard time year-7 round until congress authorizes states to observe daylight saving 8 time year-round. The legislature also recognizes the potential impact 9 the time zone has on communities along the border between Washington 10 and other states and intends to allow the state to continue to review 11 whether Pacific Standard Time should remain the standard time for 12 Washington state or whether the state should seek authorization 13 through the United States department of transportation to change 14 15 Washington state to Mountain Standard Time year-round if year-round 16 daylight saving time is not authorized by congress.

17 Sec. 2. RCW 1.20.050 and 1953 c 2 s 1 are each amended to read 18 as follows:

19 <u>(1) The standard time for the state of Washington is the zone</u> 20 <u>designated by the United States department of transportation for the</u> 21 <u>state of Washington under the uniform time act, 15 U.S.C. Secs. 261</u> 22 <u>and 263, as determined by reference to coordinated universal time.</u>

23 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary by 24 the United States government relating to adoption of daylight saving 25 time by all of the states, the state of Washington elects to reject 26 such time and elects to continue in force the terms of subsection (1) 27 of this section, relating to standard time in Washington.

28 (3) No county, city, or other political subdivision of this state shall adopt any provision for the observance of daylight saving time, 29 30 or any time other than standard((τ except pursuant to a gubernatorial 31 proclamation declaring an emergency during a period of national war and authorizing such adoption, or)) unless ((other than standard)) 32 33 another time is established on a national basis: PROVIDED, That this section shall not apply to orders made by federal authorities in a 34 local area entirely under federal control. 35

36 <u>(4) This section shall not be construed to affect the standard</u> 37 <u>time established by United States law governing the movements of</u> 38 <u>common carriers engaged in interstate commerce or the time for</u> 39 <u>performance of an act by an officer or department of the United</u> 1 States, as established by a statute, lawful order, rule, or

2 regulation of the United States or an agency thereof.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. RCW 1.20.051 (Daylight saving time) and 17 2018 c 22 s 2, 1963 c 14 s 1, & 1961 c 3 s 1 are each repealed.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. Section 3 of this act expires when the 19 contingency in section 5, chapter 297, Laws of 2019 occurs.

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. Section 4 of this act takes effect when 21 the contingency in section 5, chapter 297, Laws of 2019 occurs.

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
