1 AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; making appropriations and
2 authorizing expenditures for capital improvements; amending RCW
3 43.19.501, 28B.15.210, 28B.15.310, 28B.20.725, 28B.30.750,

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

14 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
15 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
16 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
17 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
18 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects
19 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
20 ending June 30, 2023, out of the several funds specified in this act.

1 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
2 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

3 (a) "Fiscal year 2022" or "FY 2022" means the period beginning
4 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.

5 (b) "Fiscal year 2023" or "FY 2023" means the period beginning
6 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.

7 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
8 unappropriated status.

9 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
10 only for the specified purpose.

11 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
12 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
13 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
14 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

15 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
16 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
17 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
18 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
19 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
20 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
21 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2023-2025
22 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
23 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
24 the project or program in the future.

25 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
26 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
27 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
28 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
29 remaining on June 30, 2021, from the 2019-2021 biennial
30 appropriations for each project.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7001.** RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure
4 of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond

29 reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop
30 life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The

5 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand
6 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the
7 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital
8 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or
9 institution of higher education and only between capital projects
10 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur
11 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants
12 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such
13 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes
14 that govern the grants.

15 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is
16 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only
17 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is
18 substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids
19 have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty
20 that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can
21 be completed within the biennium for less than the amount
22 appropriated in this act.

23 (3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each
24 project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's
25 budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative
26 history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a
27 project in a different way.

28 (4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except
29 emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed
30 with the legislative fiscal committees of the senate and house of
31 representatives by the office of financial management at least thirty
32 days before the date the transfer is effected. The office of
33 financial management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers
34 within thirty days from the date of transfer.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7008.** (1) It is expected that projects be
36 ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of
37 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in
38 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more
39 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of

1 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs
2 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to
3 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate
4 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/
5 community projects, and minor works.

6 (2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations
7 and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate
8 infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation
9 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural
10 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition
11 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional
12 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

13 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate
14 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and
15 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever
16 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

17 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7009.** (1) Any building project that receives
18 over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to
19 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that
20 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building
21 attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle
22 performance, and occupant productivity, and minimizes greenhouse gas
23 emissions. The following design and construction attributes must be
24 integrated into the building project:

25 (a) **Employ integrated design principles:** Use a collaborative,
26 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains
27 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and
28 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water,
29 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other
30 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals
31 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all
32 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

33 (b) **Commissioning:** Employ commissioning practices tailored to the
34 size and complexity of the building and its system components in
35 order to verify performance of building components and systems and
36 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an
37 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning
38 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan,

1 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be
2 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

3 (c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building
4 performance target that takes into account the intended use,
5 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design
6 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major
7 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy
8 use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by fifty
9 percent below prerenovations baseline.

10 (d) On-site renewable energy: Implement renewable energy
11 generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-
12 cycle cost effective.

13 (e) High-efficiency electric equipment: Use only high-efficiency
14 electric equipment for water and space heating needs not met through
15 on-site renewable energy, when life-cycle cost effective.

16 (f) Measurement and verification: For buildings over 50,000
17 square feet, install building level electricity meters in new major
18 construction and renovation projects to track and continuously
19 optimize performance. Include equivalent meters for natural gas and
20 steam, where natural gas and steam are used. Where appropriate,
21 install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize
22 occupants on energy use.

23 (g) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of
24 operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building
25 performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building
26 and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

27 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7010.** State agencies, including institutions
28 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
29 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
30 for operating expenditures.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7011.** Executive Order No. 05-05,
32 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November
33 10, 2005. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in
34 this executive order and must consult with the department of
35 archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes on the
36 potential effects of projects on cultural resources and historic
37 properties proposed in state-funded construction or acquisition
38 projects, including grant or pass-through funding that culminates in

1 construction or land acquisitions. Consultation with the department
2 of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be
3 initiated early in the project planning process, prior to
4 construction or taking title.

5 **Sec. 7012.** RCW 43.19.501 and 2020 c 356 s 7005 are each amended
6 to read as follows:

7 The Thurston county capital facilities account is created in the
8 state treasury. The account is subject to the appropriation and
9 allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW. Moneys in the account
10 may be expended for capital projects in facilities owned and managed
11 by the department in Thurston county.

12 During the 2019-2021 and 2021-2023 fiscal (~~biennium~~) biennia,
13 the Thurston county capital facilities account may be appropriated
14 for costs associated with staffing to support capital budget and
15 project activities and lease and facility oversight activities.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7013.** FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK
17 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this
18 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided
19 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

20 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
21 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work
22 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for
23 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

24 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
25 for original construction of any public building by a state agency
26 identified in RCW 43.17.200 is provided solely for the purposes of
27 RCW 43.17.200.

28 (4) At least eighty percent of the moneys spent by the Washington
29 state arts commission during the 2021-2023 biennium for the purposes
30 of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be expended solely
31 for direct acquisition of works of art. Except for art allocations
32 made under K-3 class size reduction grants under section 5023 of this
33 act, art allocations not expended within the ensuing two biennia will
34 lapse. The commission may use up to \$200,000 of this amount to
35 conserve or maintain existing pieces in the state art collection.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7014.** To carry out the provisions of this
2 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design,

5 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the
6 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may
7 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local

9 prior approval of the director of financial management in
10 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house
11 of representatives capital budget committee.

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7016.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
13 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money
14 or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with
15 RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be
16 timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds
17 the intended state share of total project costs.

24 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the

26 bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building
27 construction account as deemed necessary by the state finance
28 committee to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules
29 and regulations pertaining to the use of nontaxable bond proceeds.
30 Portions of the general obligation bond proceeds authorized by
31 chapter . . ., Laws of 2021, (Z-0106/21 (State General Bonds and

12 for minor works may not be initially allotted until agencies submit
13 project lists to the office of financial management for review and

4 (d) Minor works preservation projects may include program
5 improvements of no more than twenty-five percent of the individual
6 minor works preservation project cost.

7 (e) Improvements for accessibility in compliance with the
8 Americans with disabilities act may be included in any of the minor
9 works categories.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7019. FOR THE STATE TREASURER—TRANSFERS**

11 (1) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer
12 to the drinking water assistance account, up to
13 \$5,500,000 for fiscal year 2022 and up to \$5,500,000 for
14 fiscal year 2023 \$11,000,000

15 (2) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer
16 to the statewide broadband account, \$20,000,000 for fiscal
17 year 2022 and \$20,000,000 for fiscal year 2023. \$40,000,000

18 (3) Public Works Assistance Account: For
19 transfer to the water pollution control revolving
20 account, up to \$6,000,000 for fiscal year 2022 and
21 up to \$6,000,000 for fiscal year 2023. \$12,000,000

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7020.** To the extent that any appropriation
23 authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building
24 construction account, or from any other capital project account in
25 the state treasury, for a capital project or program that is
26 specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the
27 legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or
28 program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are
29 intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum
30 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7021.** In order to accelerate the reduction of
32 embodied carbon and improve the environmental performance of
33 construction materials, agencies shall, whenever possible, review and
34 consider embodied carbon reported in environmental product
35 declarations when evaluating proposed structural materials for
36 construction projects.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7022.** Consistent with Z-0136/21 (Wage Freeze
2 and Furlough), agencies must track and manage any savings resulting
3 from furloughs and nonimplementation of wage increases. Agencies must
4 report all such program and project savings for fiscal year 2022 to
5 the office of financial management by September 1, 2020, and must
6 report actual and projected program and project savings for fiscal
7 year 2023 to the office of financial management by June 30, 2023. If
8 the bill is not enacted by June 30, 2021, this section is void.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7023.** The joint legislative task force

16 (1) The council shall identify budget priorities and levels of
17 funding for higher education, including the two and four-year

37 bodies under the following mitigation sequence:

38 (a) Avoiding impacts by: (i) Complying with mitigation required
39 by adopted rules that set forth minimum flows, levels, or closures;

1 or (ii) making the water diversion or withdrawal subject to the
2 applicable minimum flows or levels; or

3 (b) Where avoidance of impacts is not reasonably attainable,
4 minimizing impacts by providing permanent new or existing trust water
5 rights or through other types of replacement water supply resulting
6 in no net annual increase in the quantity of water diverted or
7 withdrawn from the stream or surface water body and no net
8 detrimental impacts to fish and related aquatic resources; or

9 (c) Where avoidance and minimization are not reasonably
10 attainable, compensating for impacts by providing net ecological
11 benefits to fish and related aquatic resources in the water resource
12 inventory area through in-kind or out-of-kind mitigation or a
13 combination thereof, that improves the function and productivity of
14 affected fish populations and related aquatic habitat. Out-of-kind
15 mitigation may include instream or out-of-stream measures that
16 improve or enhance existing water quality, riparian habitat, or other
17 instream functions and values for which minimum instream flows or
18 closures were established in that watershed.

19 (10) The department must monitor the implementation of the pilot
20 projects, including all mitigation associated with each pilot
21 project, approved under this section at least annually through
22 December 31, 2028.

23 (11) The pilot projects eligible for processing under this
24 section, based on criteria as of January 19, 2018, include:

25 (a) A city operating a group A water system in Kitsap county and
26 water resource inventory area 15, with a population between 13,000
27 and 14,000;

28 (b) A city operating a group A water system in Pierce county and
29 water resource inventory area 10, with a population between 9,500 and
30 10,500;

31 (c) A city operating a group A water system in Thurston county
32 and water resource inventory area 11, with a population between 8,500
33 and 9,500;

34 (d) A nonprofit mutual water system operating a group A water
35 system in Pierce county and water resource inventory area 12, with
36 between 10,500 and 11,500 service connections; and

37 (e) An irrigation district located in Whatcom county and water
38 resource inventory area 1, solely for the purpose of processing
39 changes of water rights from surface water to groundwater, and
40 implementing flow augmentation to benefit instream flows.

1 (12) Water right applicants eligible to be processed under this
2 pilot project authority must elect to be included in the pilot
3 project review by notifying the department by July 1, 2018. Once an
4 applicant notifies the department of its intent to be processed under
5 this pilot project authority, subsection (9) of this section applies
6 to final decisions issued by the department, even if such a final
7 decision is issued after the expiration of this section.

8 (13) By November 15, 2018, the department must furnish the task
9 force with information on conceptual mitigation plans for each water
10 resource mitigation pilot project application. By November 15, 2019,
11 and November 15, 2022, the department must provide the task force
12 with an update on the mitigation plans based on additional
13 information developed after November 15, 2018.

14 (14) To ensure that the processing of pilot project applications
15 can inform the task force process in a timely manner, the department
16 must expedite processing of applications for water resource
17 mitigation pilot projects. The applicant for each pilot project must
18 reimburse the department for the department's costs of processing the
19 applicant's application.

20 (15) The water resource mitigation pilot project authority
21 granted to the department does not affect or modify any other
22 procedural requirements of chapter 90.03, 90.44, or 90.54 RCW that
23 apply to the processing of such applications.

24 (16) The joint legislative task force expires December 31,
25 ~~((2020))~~ 2022. During the period from November 16, 2019, through
26 December 31, ~~((2020))~~ 2022, the work of the task force is limited to:

27 (a) A review of any additional information that may be developed
28 after November 15, 2019, as a result of the pilot projects
29 established under subsection (9) of this section; and

30 (b) An update of the task force's November 15, 2019,
31 recommendations (~~(under subsection (8) of this section)~~).

32 (17) This section expires January 1, 2029.

33 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7037.** The public use general aviation airport
34 loan revolving account is created in the custody of the state
35 treasurer. All receipts from moneys directed by law to the account
36 must be deposited into the account. Expenditures from the account may
37 be used only for the purposes described in section 7038 of this act.
38 Only the community aviation revitalization board or the board's
39 designee may authorize expenditures from the account. The account is

1 subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an
2 appropriation is not required for expenditures.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7038.** (1)(a) The community aviation
4 revitalization board is established to exercise the powers granted
5 under this section.

6 (b) The board must consist of a representative from the
7 department of transportation's aviation division, the public works
8 board, and a nonlegislative member of the community economic
9 revitalization board. The board must also consist of the following
10 members appointed by the secretary of transportation: One port
11 district official, one county official, one city official, one
12 representative of airport managers, and one representative of a
13 general aviation pilots organization within Washington that has an
14 active membership and established location, chapter, or appointed
15 representative within Washington. The appointive members must
16 initially be appointed to terms as follows: Two members for two-year
17 terms, and three members for three-year terms that must include the
18 chair. Thereafter, each succeeding term must be for three years. The
19 secretary of transportation must select the chair of the board. The
20 members of the board must elect one of their members to serve as vice
21 chair.

22 (c) The department of transportation must provide management
23 services, including fiscal and contract services, to assist the board
24 in implementing this section.

25 (d) If a vacancy occurs by death, resignation, or otherwise of
26 appointive members of the board, the secretary of transportation must
27 fill the vacancy for the unexpired term. Members of the board may be
28 removed for malfeasance or misfeasance in office, upon specific
29 written charges by the secretary of transportation, under chapter
30 34.05 RCW.

31 (e) A member appointed by the secretary of transportation may not
32 be absent from more than 50 percent of the regularly scheduled
33 meetings in any one calendar year. Any member who exceeds this
34 absence limitation has withdrawn from the board and may be replaced
35 by the secretary of transportation.

36 (f) A majority of members currently appointed constitutes a
37 quorum.

38 (g) The board must meet three times a year or as deemed necessary
39 by the department of transportation.

1 (h) The department of transportation must provide staff support
2 as needed.

3 (2) In addition to other applicable provisions of law pertaining
4 to conflicts of interest of public officials, any community aviation
5 revitalization board member, appointive or otherwise, may not
6 participate in any decision on any board contract in which the board
7 member has any interests, direct or indirect, with any firm,
8 partnership, corporation, or association that would be the recipient
9 of any aid under this section. If such participation occurs, the
10 board must void the transaction and the involved member is subject to
11 further sanctions as provided by law. The board must adopt a code of
12 ethics for its members, which must be designed to protect the state
13 and its citizens from any unethical conduct by the board.

14 (3) The community aviation revitalization board may:

15 (a) Adopt bylaws for the regulation of its affairs and the
16 conduct of its business;

17 (b) Adopt an official seal and alter the seal at its pleasure;

18 (c) Use the services of other governmental agencies;

19 (d) Accept from any federal agency loans or grants for the
20 planning or financing of any project and enter into an agreement with
21 the agency respecting the loans or grants;

22 (e) Conduct examinations and investigations and take testimony at
23 public hearings of any matter material for its information that will
24 assist in determinations related to the exercise of the board's
25 lawful powers;

26 (f) Accept any gifts, grants, loans of funds, property, or
27 financial or other aid in any form from any other source on any terms
28 and conditions that are not in conflict with this section;

29 (g) Enter into agreements or other transactions with and accept
30 grants and cooperation from any governmental agency in furtherance of
31 this section;

32 (h) Adopt rules under chapter 34.05 RCW as necessary to carry out
33 the purposes of this section; and

34 (i) Perform all acts and things necessary or convenient to carry
35 out the powers expressly granted or implied under this section.

36 (4) (a) (i) The community aviation revitalization board may make
37 direct loans to airport sponsors of public use airports in the state
38 for the purpose of airport improvements that primarily support
39 general aviation activities. The board may provide loans for the
40 purpose of airport improvements only if the state is receiving

1 commensurate public benefit, which must include, as a condition of
2 the loan, a commitment to provide public access to the airport for a
3 period of time equivalent to one and one-half times the term of the
4 loan.

5 (ii) For purposes of this subsection (4)(a), "public use
6 airports" means all public use airports not listed as having more
7 than \$75,000 annual commercial air service passenger enplanements as
8 published by the federal aviation administration.

9 (b) An application for loan funds under this section must be made
10 in the form and manner that the board prescribes. When evaluating
11 loan applications, the board must prioritize applications that
12 provide conclusive justification that completion of the loan
13 application project will create revenue-generating opportunities. The
14 board is not limited to, but must also use, the following expected
15 outcome conditions when evaluating loan applications:

16 (i) A specific private development or expansion is ready to occur
17 and will occur only if the aviation facility improvement is made;

18 (ii) The loan application project results in the creation of jobs
19 or private sector capital investment as determined by the board;

20 (iii) The loan application project improves opportunities for the
21 successful maintenance, operation, or expansion of an airport or
22 adjacent airport business park;

23 (iv) The loan application project results in the creation or
24 retention of long-term economic opportunities; and

25 (v) The loan application project results in leveraging additional
26 federal funding for an airport.

27 (c)(i) If the board chooses to require a local match, the board
28 must develop guidelines for local participation and allowable match
29 and activities.

30 (ii) An application must:

31 (A) Be supported by the port district, city, or county in which
32 the project is located; or

33 (B) Clearly identify the source of funds intended to repay the
34 loan.

35 (5) The public use general aviation airport loan program, when
36 authorized by the community aviation revitalization board, is subject
37 to the following conditions:

38 (a) The moneys in the public use general aviation airport loan
39 revolving account created in section 7037 of this act must be used
40 only to fulfill commitments arising from loans authorized in this

1 section. The total outstanding amount that the board must dispense at
2 any time pursuant to this section must not exceed the moneys
3 available from the account.

4 (b) On contracts made for public use general aviation airport
5 loans, the board must determine the interest rate that loans must
6 bear. The interest rate must not exceed the amount needed to cover
7 the administrative expenses of the board and the loan program. The
8 board may provide reasonable terms and conditions for the repayment
9 of loans, with the repayment of a loan to begin no later than three
10 years after the award date of the loan. The loans must not exceed 20
11 years in duration.

12 (c) The repayment of any loan made from the public use general
13 aviation airport loan revolving account under the contracts for
14 aviation loans must be paid into the public use general aviation
15 airport loan revolving account.

16 (6) All receipts from moneys collected under this section must be
17 deposited into the public use general aviation airport loan revolving
18 account.

19 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7039.** The legislature intends to consider
20 predesign funding for the Washington state patrol crime laboratory
21 I-5 consolidated facility in the 2022 supplemental capital budget. By
22 December 1, 2021, the Washington state patrol must provide data to
23 support the request for a consolidated crime lab. The agency must
24 provide legislative fiscal staff with operating budget financial
25 information including, but not limited to, a list of each leased
26 facility that will be vacated when the consolidated lab is completed.
27 For each facility, the Washington state patrol must provide at least
28 the:

- 29 (1) Lease contract number;
- 30 (2) Lease contract term;
- 31 (3) Lease facility street address;
- 32 (4) Lease facility cost, by fund and by state fiscal year for
33 fiscal years 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023;
- 34 (5) Lease facility and maintenance staffing levels and funding by
35 state fiscal year for fiscal years 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023;
- 36 (6) The most current six year facilities plan;
- 37 (7) An estimated certificate of participation payback schedule;
- 38 and

1 (8) A summary of how the operating costs from subsection (1) of
2 this section will offset the certification of participation costs
3 from subsection (3) of this section by state fiscal year.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7040.** The department of social and health
5 services and the department of natural resources shall enter into
6 long-term, revenue generating opportunities for underused portions of
7 the Fircrest Residential Habilitation Center bounded by 15th Ave NE
8 and NE 150th Street to benefit the charitable, educational, penal,
9 and reformatory institutions account. Long-term, revenue generating
10 opportunities may include, but are not limited to, land leases, land
11 sales, and land swaps. It is the intent of the legislature that any
12 revenue obtained from these opportunities be used for services for
13 those with developmental disabilities. The department of social and
14 health services and the department of natural resources must amend
15 their lease if necessary to conform with this section.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7041.** (1) The department of natural resources
17 shall convene a work group of trust land beneficiaries and
18 stakeholders to develop a recommended process for the way trust land
19 transfer proposals are developed and implemented. Consideration
20 should be made for increasing the income value of the trusts,
21 limiting impacts to trust lands not being considered for transfer,
22 conservation value of lands that are a potential candidate for
23 transfer, and use of the land bank for securing repositioned land
24 that would result from any transferred projects, and any other items
25 necessary for a well-supported program. The department of natural
26 resources must report and make recommendations for the establishment
27 of a new trust land transfer program, in the form of proposed
28 legislation, to the fiscal committees of the legislature, by December
29 1, 2021.

30 (2) For the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium, the department of natural
31 resources may not trade, transfer, or sell any valuable material from
32 the four parcels that comprised the proposed trust land transfer
33 parcels in the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium, known as blakely island,
34 devils lake, eglon, and morning star.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7042.** (1) The department of enterprise
36 services shall convene a construction industry work group to
37 recommend how to apply successful carbon reduction strategies,

1 incorporate necessary parameters of design and construction
2 considerations, and allow for efficient and cost effective state
3 construction projects. The work group must be comprised of
4 construction industry professionals as recommended by a leading
5 association on Washington business in design, specification,
6 construction, and material supply and construction professionals that
7 have successfully realized real and measurable results. The work
8 group must also include a representative from the department of
9 enterprise services, representatives from environmental groups, and
10 someone of applicable expertise from the Washington academy of
11 sciences.

12 (2) The work group shall identify and recommend carbon reduction
13 strategies and environmental product declaration principles to
14 successfully apply in state construction projects and:

15 (a) Clarify the definition of environmental product declaration
16 to ensure that environmental product declarations (EPD) are applied
17 properly, consistently, and as intended and provide a baseline of
18 understanding based on accepted metrics to obtain measurable results
19 for state construction projects;

20 (b) Suggest a pilot project or project review to apply
21 construction industry recommendations and create an education and
22 standards brief that accompanies the report required under subsection
23 (3) of this section;

24 (c) Outline the environmental project review data collection
25 process in functional detail and use existing data gathering
26 resources such as EC3; and

27 (d) Identify measurable outcome criteria to establish a project
28 baseline summary for use during design from estimated project
29 material quantities using industry average environmental product
30 declarations.

31 (3) The work group shall provide their recommendations in a
32 report to the fiscal committees of the legislature by January 1,
33 2022.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7043.** The office of financial management must
35 compile a list of 2021-2023 fiscal biennium capital budget grant
36 programs managed by state agencies and the direct and indirect
37 administrative fee percentages charged for each. For the purposes of
38 this section, "administrative fee percentages" means rates charged by
39 state agencies and the rates grant recipients are allowed to charge

1 for direct and/or indirect administrative costs. The office of
2 financial management must submit the list of capital budget grant
3 programs and their associated administrative fee percentages to the
4 house capital budget committee and the senate ways and means
5 committee by October 1, 2021.

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7044.** If any provision of this act or its
7 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
8 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
9 persons or circumstances is not affected.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7045.** This act is necessary for the immediate
11 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of
12 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes
13 effect immediately.
